that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

Employer Training Investment (PD# 081002)

Truman College has received a grant for \$79,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Security under the Employer Training Investment program. This award will match the contributions of local companies to provide support for the training of employees. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2007 through December 31, 2008.

Malcolm X College TRIO - Upward Bound (PD# 081001)

Malcolm X College has received funding from the U.S. Department of Education for its Upward Bound Project. The project provides instruction to at-risk high school students to enhance academic skills and increase motivation to succeed in post-secondary education. The project has received funding of \$250,000 for the first year of a four-year project. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2012.

Transitional Allied Health Educational Partnership (PD# 081003)

Richard Daley College has been funded for \$7,400 as a subcontract of an award to Chicago State University from the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The funding will support a coordinator and some tutors for the project. The performance period for this award is from October 2, 2007 through October 31, 2008.

KKC Theatre Arts Afterschool Enrichment Program (PD# 081004)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a request to the Field Foundation of Illinois for \$10,000 for a project which will create opportunities for high school students to become engaged within mentor and peer

environments through the forum of theatre arts. The performance period for this project is from April 1, 2009 through March 30, 2010.

Effects of Habitat Changes in Kenya (PD# 081005)

Wright College has submitted a proposal for \$139,372 to the National Science Foundation for a project which will involve students in a collaborative research project in Kenya. The project will study habitat changes resulting from resource exploitation on globally threatened birds. The performance period for this project is from June 1, 2009 through November 30, 2009.

Technology-Based Learning Initiative (PD# 081007)

Harold Washington College has submitted a proposal for \$336,299 to the US Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration (ETA) for a project which would link geographic information systems and geostatistics for workplace success. The performance period for this project is from February 1, 2009 through January 31, 2012.

Illinois Basic Operating Award (PD#081008)

WYCC Channel 20 has received notice of the funding of its Basic Operating Grant from the Illinois Arts Council for \$101,310 to be spent on basic operating costs of WYCC. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009.

DCFS Tuition Reimbursement (PD# 081009)

The District Office has entered into an intergovernment agreement with the Department of Children and Family Services of the State of Illinois which will provide an estimated \$85,817.33 for tuition and fee payments for Illinois state employees. The performance period for this agreement is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

GIFTS AND DONATIONS

TimeLink Biometric Time Clock (PD# 081006)

TimeLink, Inc., of Purchase, New York, has loaned the District Office, for evaluation purposes, a biometric time clock, which is valued at approximately \$1,500. The Office of Human Resources will evaluate

the use of the biometric time clock during a one year period, beginning on September 1, 2008.
