NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

Summer Programs Food Services (PD# 080901)

The City Colleges of Chicago has been approved for funding of \$56,206 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide food services (lunch and snacks) for participants of Summer, 2008 programs at four of the colleges. The summer programs will be at Daley College, Malcolm X College, Olive Harvey College and Truman College. The District's approved vendor for cafeteria and vending services, the Compass Group, will be utilized for these programs. Food services would be provided during the period from June 16, 2008 through August 30, 2008.

Tourneés Festival (PD# 080902)

Olive-Harvey College has submitted a proposal for \$1,800 to the French American Cultural Exchange (FACE) to support their participation in FACE's French Film grant program, the *Tourneés Festival*. For its participation, Olive-Harvey will host cultural activities on campus. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

Youth Skills Development Training Program (PD# 080903)

Olive-Harvey College has submitted a proposal to the Alternative Schools Network, in Chicago, for \$249,375. The award will support Olive-Harvey Middle College students who are wards of the state. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

New Futures (PD# 080904)

Olive-Harvey College is submitting a proposal to the Alternative Schools Network, in Chicago, for \$26,000. The award will support senior Olive-Harvey Middle College students who are wards of the state. The

performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

Children and Youth Services (PD# 080905)

Olive-Harvey College is submitting a proposal to the Alternative Schools Network, in Chicago, for \$72,200. The award will support at least 19 Olive-Harvey Middle College students. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

Re-Enrolled Student Project at Olive-Harvey College (PD# 080906)

Olive-Harvey College is submitting a proposal for \$80,000 to the Alternative Schools Network, in Chicago, for a project that will provide certified academic skills instructors to enhance the use of computer labs for academic programs at the Olive-Harvey Middle College, so as to better prepare students for post secondary education. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

Career Pathways (PD# 080907)

Olive-Harvey College is submitting a proposal to the Youth Connection Charter Schools Network for \$40,000. The project will support a model for the development of the Career Pathways Project in the Olive-Harvey Middle College. The project will include training and support for curriculum development. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation (PD# 080908)

The District Office anticipates receiving notification of refunding by the Youth Connection Charter School (with funds flowing through the Chicago Public Schools) for a program to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts in the CCC middle colleges. Anticipated funding for the Middle College Program at Olive-Harvey College is \$1,224,336 and at Truman College is \$911,598. Additional funds will be provided by the Illinois State Board of Education under *Supplemental General State Aid* (SGSA) and by the U.S. Department of Education using Title I funding. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

Health Occupation Careers: Nursing Programs (PD# 080909)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education for a grant which will strengthen health occupation careers in the areas of nursing for those individuals who are considered to be disadvantaged

or needy. The proposal requests a grant of \$1,119,141 for the performance period from October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2010.

Women in Nanotechnology (PD# 080910)

Truman College has received an award of \$5,000 from the US Department of Labor's Women's Bureau to raise awareness of nanotechnology careers for at least 10 women who are community college students. The project includes field trips, scholarships, e-mentoring and an opportunity to compete for \$500 scholarships. The performance period for this project is from August 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

City Science FIRST Robotics (PD#080911)

Harold Washington College has submitted a request for \$20,000 to the Motorola Foundation for support for WYCC's City Science series of television programs. The program developed through this grant funding will highlight the technology of robotics and hybrid technology both at Motorola and at Illinois Institute of Technology. The performance period for this funding will be from August 1, 2008 through July 31, 2009.

City Science - Honda in America (PD# 080912)

WYCC has submitted a request for \$90,000 to the American Honda Foundation for support for WYCC's City Science series of television programs. The support will make possible the production of 12 - 14 half-hour episodes for national dissemination. The show is targeted at middle school students, their teachers and parents. The performance period for this project will be from October 1, 2008 through December 31, 2009.

WYCC - Abbott Fund Program Support (PD# 080913)

WYCC has submitted a request for \$75,000 to the Abbott Fund to support programming for cultural, minority and community events.

WYCC - Walgreens Program Support (PD# 080914)

WYCC has submitted a request for \$75,000 to the Walgreens Foundation to support programming for cultural, minority and community events.
