that, Richard J. Daley College presented at the 23rd Annual Conference of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU), October 31-November 2, 2009. The presentation was entitled *Grow Your Own Teachers Grant Program: A Look into a Partnership between Higher Education Institutions and Community Organizations*, and demonstrated a best practice model for university, community college and CBO collaboration.

that, Richard J. Daley College was a founding partner for the Grow Your Own (GYO) Consortium in 2006. Daley College, in collaboration with Northeastern Illinois University, Action Now and the Southwest Organizing Project (SWOP), developed an educational pipeline for community residents to become elementary school teachers. The GYO partnership provides financial assistance to students including, tuition/fees, books, instructional materials, laptops, transportation, tutoring and mentoring. Upon completion of the baccalaureate degree, program participants agree to work in a neighborhood elementary school for five years.
