NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS (Total Value \$9,444,712)

The Keystone Center for Effective Teaching of the Developmental Mathematics (PD# 090701)

Daley College has submitted a proposal to create a Center for the effective teaching of developmental mathematics with computer technology. The proposal, to the National Science Foundation, requests \$149,728 to create a movable computer laboratory and demonstrate the effectiveness of the Keystone method for teaching mathematics. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011.

Exemplary Research Career Opportunity Intervention for Community Colleges (PD# 090702)

Kennedy-King College has agreed to be a partner in an innovative research proposal, submitted by the University of Maryland, Baltimore County, to the National Institutes of Health, for a project that will design and explore the effectiveness of an intervention to increase the number of underrepresented minority students who enter graduate studies for careers as research scientists. The two year project requests a total of \$999,329 and will subcontract with Kennedy-King College during the period from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011.

After School Matters - Careers College Success Programs (PD# 090703)

Kennedy-King College has received an award of \$5,639 from After School Matters, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation to support pre-apprentice and apprentice programs in the area of automotive technology. The six week programs will offer hands-on experience for high school students. The performance period for this project is from May 17, 2009 through August 31, 2009.

Summer Programs Food Services (PD# 090709)

The City Colleges of Chicago has been approved for funding of \$56,206 from the Illinois State Board of Education to provide food services (lunch and snacks) for participants of Summer, 2009 programs at four of the colleges. The summer programs will be at Malcolm X College and Olive Harvey College. The District's approved vendor for cafeteria and vending services, the Compass Group, will be utilized for these programs. Food services would be provided during the period from June 16, 2009 through August 30, 2009.

Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation (PD# 090704)

The District Office anticipates receiving notification of refunding by the Youth Connection Charter School (with funds flowing through the Chicago Public Schools) for a program to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts in the CCC middle colleges. Anticipated funding for the Middle College Program at Olive-Harvey College is \$1,224,336 and at Truman College is \$911,598. Additional funds will be provided by the Illinois State Board of Education under *Supplemental General State Aid* (SGSA) and by the U.S. Department of Education using Title I funding. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

Americans With Disabilities Act Compliance Grant Agreement (PD# 090705)

The Illinois Community College Board has awarded the District Office with a grant of \$1,135,037 to be utilized for projects at five locations throughout the District to make ADA improvements including elevator modifications, toilet room modifications and to provide accessible parking spaces. The performance period for this project is from June 15, 2009 through December 31, 2010.

Daley College Title V Proposal (PD# 090706)

Daley College has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education under its Title V: Developing Hispanic Institutions Program. The proposal requests \$568,080 for the first year of a five-year project which will serve Hispanic students and other students at Daley College during the early stages of their college careers by providing High School counseling and dual enrollment, orientation sessions and college success courses and with a special outreach to GED completers. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2014.

Malcolm X Title V Proposal (PD# 090719)

Malcolm X College has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Education under its Title V: Developing Hispanic Institutions Program. The proposal requests \$2,395,539 for a five-year project which will serve Hispanic students and other students at Malcolm X College by the use of *studio classrooms* to enhance the learning environment. The performance period for this project is from October 10, 2009 through September 30, 2014.

Innovative Nursing Expansion PBI Project (PD# 090707)

Olive-Harvey College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education's, "Strengthening Minority-Serving Institutions" program. The one-year project would provide \$597,513 to strengthen nursing programs for disadvantaged students at the College by providing improved simulation and enhanced audio-visual tutorials for nursing students. The performance period for the project is from October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010.

Nursing Simulation Learning Center PBI Project (PD# 090708)

Malcolm X College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education's, "Strengthening Minority-Serving Institutions" program. The one-year project would provide \$600,000 to strengthen nursing programs for disadvantaged students at the College by providing a nursing simulation learning center for nursing students. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2009 through August 31, 2010.

Nursing Programs: Men in Nursing PBI Project (PD# 090717)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal to the US Department of Education's, "Strengthening Minority-Serving Institutions" program. The one-year project would provide \$600,000 to strengthen the nursing program by recruiting and supporting the participation of male students and by promoting men's health through various media projects. The performance period for the project is from September 1, 2009 through August 31, 2010.

Olive-Harvey Middle College Summer Youth Employment (PD# 090710)

Olive-Harvey College is receiving an award of \$14,800 from the Alternative Schools Network to provide support services for 20 youth and 2 youth supervisors who will participate in a Vocational Skills Camp at the College. The participants will also receive a stipend directly from ASN using funding from the City of Chicago (from Federal funding). The performance period for this project is from June 29, 2009 through August 30, 2009.

After School Matters - Washburn Culinary Institute (PD# 090711)

Kennedy-King College has received an award of \$27,074 from After School Matters, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, to support club and sports activities and pre-apprentice and apprentice programs for up to 150 teenagers. The programs will offer hands-on experiences and skill development in the culinary arts and will focus on the *International Buffet*. The performance period for this project is from May 17, 2009 through August 31, 2009.

Digital Television Transition Grant (PD# 090714)

WYCC - TV 20 has received an award of \$19,833 from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting to help with the conversion of public television to digital format. The performance period for this award is from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

City Science for WYCC - TV (PD# 090715)

WYCC-TV has submitted a proposal to the Rohm and Haas Company Contributions program for \$30,000 to support the City Science TV series. The performance period for this request is from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

City Block Grants: Kennedy-King College Success and Future Business Leaders of America (PD# 090716)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$60,000 to the City of Chicago, Office of Budget and Management to support career programs in collaboration with TEAM Englewood's Business Professionals of America Club, to participate in the College Success Program. The performance period for the project is from February 1, 2010 through January 30, 2011.

Malcolm X Eliminate the Digital Divide Project (PD# 090718)

Malcolm X College has received an award of \$50,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a project which will provide computer training to low-income individuals in west side communities, including Austin, East and West Garfield Park and North Lawndale. The performance period for this project is from June 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

CONTINUATION FUNDING (Total Amount \$692,866)

Collaboration to Improve Hispanic Transfer & Degree Completion (PD# 041114-Yr5)

Truman College has received an award of \$692,866 for the fifth year of a five year project in which Truman and St. Augustine College will collaborate to support transfer systems and improve faculty skills for the success of predominately Hispanic students. The funding is from the U.S. Department of Education under its Title V: Developing Hispanic Institutions Program. The award includes a subaward of 273,802 for St. Augustine College of during year five. The performance period for the fifth year of the five year project is from October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009.

GIFTS (Total Estimated Value \$100,350)

Dual Beam Cathode Ray Oscilloscope (PD# 090712)

Wright College has received a donation of an Allen & Du Mont dual beam cathode ray oscilloscope with an estimated value of \$100 from John H. Taylor of Oak Park, Illinois.

Martin J. And Susan B. Kozak Fund (PD# 090713)

WYCC - TV 20 has received a donation of \$250 to support programming from the Martin J. And Susan B. Kozak Fund, a donor advised fund of The Chicago Community Foundation which is the corporate affiliate of The Chicago Community Trust.

Park National Bank Sponsorship Contribution (PD# 090720)

Park National Bank has announced that they will make a contribution of \$25,000 to Kennedy-King College for use in supporting marketing efforts of the College and to advance the College's mission. Included in this funding will be a Park National Bank scholarship of 1,000 for the period of August 1, 2009 to July, 31, 2010.

Nursing Support (PD# 090721)

The international law firm, Holland and Knight, has agreed to donate \$75,000 to support the nursing program at the City Colleges of Chicago.
