AMENDMENT

<u>Truants' Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) (PD# 080620)</u>

The District Office has requested funding of \$2,721,240 for a continuation project from the Illinois State Board of Education. This program is a unique partnership between public, private and community-based organizations designed to provide alternative educational programs and services to reclaimed youth, 16-21 years old, who have dropped out of high school. The Truman Middle College will receive \$535,500 and the Olive Harvey Middle College will receive \$535,500 from this funding. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. From the grant funds, the following diploma programs and GED programs will utilize subcontracts from the City Colleges of Chicago:

The amended agreements, approved by the funder, will reduce the amount to Bronzeville by \$30,047.05 and increase the amount to Alternative Schools Network by the same amount. The new totals will be \$77,952.95 for Bronzeville and \$110,047.05 for Alternative Schools Network.
