that in Board Report # 27783 adopted January 4, 2007 the Board authorized Flood Brothers Disposal to provide scavenger services for the removal of waste from all City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) facilities and to maintain sanitary conditions District Wide in the amount of \$98,600.40 in accordance with the specification number, IW0627 dated November 13, 2006; and

that the Office of Administrative Services is requesting additional funding to settle a dispute for services rendered by Flood Brothers Disposal for outstanding invoices from Kennedy-King College in the amount of \$12,145.00 due to missing invoices that were never submitted for payment in FY 2008 and Malcolm X College in the amount of \$12,620.35 due to a dispute over the size of the dumpster and discrepancies in billing in FY2007 and FY2008; and

that it was necessary to resolve these disputes with the scavenger services company to avoid a public health risk to the community and to avoid a disruption in services; and

that the Office of M/WBE Contract Compliance has reviewed the above referenced District Wide scavenger service and determined that Flood Brothers Disposal is in compliance with the Board approved Participation Plan.

RECOMMENDS that the Board of Trustees approves the dispute settlement in the amount of \$12,145.00 for services rendered at Kennedy-King College and in the amount of \$12,620.35 for services rendered at Malcolm X College for outstanding invoices from previous years' budgets with Flood Brothers Disposal, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois in accordance with the specification number, IW0627 dated November 13, 2006.
