that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS (Total Value - \$7,559,391)

Process Technology Program (PD# 090102)

Olive-Harvey College, in conjunction with the Chicago Urban League and other partners, has submitted a proposal for \$2,000,000 to the US Department of Labor. The three year project will provide an integrated training project which responds to both student needs and employer requirements in the process technology field. The performance period for this project is from April 15, 2009 through April 14, 2012.

5 Star Hospitality Advantage Program (PD# 090103)

Kennedy-King College, in conjunction with Aramark Education, Alchemy Systems and other partners, has submitted a proposal for \$2,199,130 to the US Department of Labor. The three year project will build capacity and provide training programs for hospitality management services in the Chicago area. The performance period for this project is from February 1, 2009 through February 1, 2012.

Rx: Prescription for a Career in Healthcare(PD# 090104)

Malcolm X College, in conjunction with the Chicago Public Schools, Rush University Medical Center and other partners, has submitted a proposal for \$1,632,021 to the US Department of Labor. The three year project will be a regional healthcare capacity building initiative designed to address critical skills shortage in six on the College's 16 allied health career programs. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2011.

<u>Carreras en Salud - Vertical and Horizontal Expansion Initiative (PD# 090105)</u>

Wilbur Wright College, in conjunction with the Instituto del Progreso Latino, the Association House of Chicago, the Metropolitan Chicago Healthcare Council and other partners, has submitted a proposal for \$1,653,240 to the

US Department of Labor. The three year project will provide training in vocational English as a second language and a Certified Medical Assistant component for the horizontal expansion bridge and links to a Registered Nurse program for the vertical expansion. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2011.

Bridge to Manufacturing Careers (PD# 090106)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$75,000 to the Illinois Community College Board. The project will develop a manufacturing bridge program in partnership with the Arturo Velasquez West Side Technical Institute, the Humbolt Park Vocational Center and Central States SE - Jobs for Progress, Inc. The program will provide training for low-skilled, low-income adults and incumbent workers who are unprepared to enter post-secondary education. The performance period for this project is from January 1, 2009 through June 30, 2009.

AMENDMENTS (Total Value - An Increase of \$72,030)

Dropout Retrieval: Empowerment for Academic Matriculation (PD# 080908)

The District Office anticipates receiving notification of refunding by the Youth Connection Charter School (with funds flowing through the Chicago Public Schools) for a program to provide academic programs and services for retrieved high school dropouts in the CCC middle colleges. Anticipated funding for the Middle College Program at Olive-Harvey College is \$1,224,336 and at Truman College is \$911,598. Additional funds will be provided by the Illinois State Board of Education under Supplemental General State Aid (SGSA) and by the U.S. Department of Education using Title I funding. The performance period for this project is from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. Truman College has now received additional funding of \$72,030 which includes approved funding of \$20,000 for Community TV Network to provide a program in film making for the Truman Middle College students. This program will provide a video instructor (\$14,000) and the use of studio quality equipment (\$6,000) during the period from February 5, 2009 through June 30, 2009.

GIFTS (Total Value - \$500)

Pre School Reading Library (PD# 090101)

Olive-Harvey College has received a certificate which can be redeemed for a Pre School reading library of materials, valued at \$500.00, and ordered from

the Magic Tree Bookstore. The certificate is a gift to the Day Care Center from the Chicago Public Schools Community Partnership Program.
