Vice Chancellor Henderson provided an overview of Olive-Harvey and Truman Colleges' Middle School. Chairman Chico and Chancellor Hyman both attended their graduations in the spring. Vice Chancellor Henderson reported on the success of both programs. Last year Olive-Harvey Middle College served 203 students, averaged a 71% retention rate, 85% attendance rate and a graduation rate of 100%. Truman Middle College provides a secondary education program to a diverse, at-risk, dropout population. 85 seniors graduated from Truman's Middle College in the 2009-1010 academic year.

The Vice Chancellor introduced Kennedy-King College President, John Dozier who spoke about a grant from ICCB and a partnership with IDOT to establish a Highway Construction Careers Training Program (HCCTP) that is intended to increase the number of minorities, women, and disadvantaged individuals working on highway construction projects. The grant period extends through June 30, 2011 and is for a total of \$376,188. CCC will train at least 45 students under this grant. Chairman Chico suggested that Board members invite construction business owners/managers to the table that would provide employment for the students graduating from the program.

REPORTS that as of the end of Spring 2010, unduplicated headcount enrollment in all careers reached 76,175 students (Table 1). This represents an increase of 7.6% compared to Spring 2009. The Full-Time-Equivalent (FTE) enrollment reached 40,590 (Table 2), an increase of 9.3%

Headcount enrollment in the Semester Credit Career reached 41,022 students, an increase of 13.9 percent over the previous year. The Semester Credit Career FTE enrollment reached 27,192, which represents an 16.4% increase over the previous year.

Headcount enrollment in the Vocational Skills Career reached 1,032 students, a decrease of 7.6% compared to Spring 2009 (Table 1). FTE enrollment reached 506, a decrease of 5.8 percent (Table 2).

Headcount enrollment in the Adult Education career reached 23,564 students, an increase of 0.8% compared to Spring 2009 (Table 1). FTE enrollment reached 12,423, a decrease of 3.4% from Spring 2009 (Table 2).

Headcount enrollment in the Continuing Education Career reached 13,837 students, an increase of 13.0% compared to Spring 2009 (Table 1). FTE enrollment reached 470, an increase of 21.1% from the previous year (Table 2).
