<u>After School Matters - Careers College Success Programs (PD# 100605)</u>

Kennedy-King College has requested an award of \$8,000 from After School Matters, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: will allow the College to support pre-apprentice and apprentice programs in the area of automotive technology and science. The six week programs will offer hands-on experience for high school students.
