# **REPORTS**

that the Illinois Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Professional Certification Association (IAODAPCA) and District 1600 Board of Trustees approved the proposal of faculty member Jacqueline Sylvestal (Addictions Studies Program), to establish Kennedy-King College as an official certification-testing site. It will become the only testing facility within the Chicago metropolitan area. Any eligible Illinois resident may take the Certified Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Counselor (CADC) Illinois Examination. Applicants must meet all requirements to obtain certification in the State of Illinois, which include 225 hours addiction counseling courses, and 150 hours of supervision that is provided through the Addictions Studies Practicum; and

that the Human Services Department is strengthening ties with the community via participation in coalition efforts sponsored by the Chicago Commons/Englewood Organization. The intent is to develop strategies to prevent alcohol abuse in the Englewood community. Two students in the department are members; they are joined by law enforcement personnel, local politicians, civic leaders, businesspersons, entrepreneurs, educators, and high school students; and

that the Addictions Studies Program hosted an "Opiate Dependency" workshop at KKC for over one hundred professionals (stakeholders) in the field of addictions. Program Coordinator Larry Ross, and Adjunct Faculty Leslie Illidge made presentations. Participants received valuable CEUs to document their professional enhancement; and

that twenty-six faculty, students, and alumnae of the Social Services Program attended the 42nd Annual National Association of Black Social Workers in Philadelphia Pennsylvania. Two students made presentations at one of the general assemblies.
