NEW PROPOSALS (Total Amount Proposed \$267,056)

Gear-Up (PD# 101001)

Truman College anticipates the award of \$60,000 for the continuation of the Gear-Up project, as a sub award from Northeastern Illinois University.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This award will allow the District to continue its partnership in the US Department of Education funded project to support and improve educational services and programs throughout Chicago.

Accountability: Ms. Karen Sandler, Director of Student Development at Truman College, will be the project director and will have program and fiscal responsibility for all aspects of the project.

Other Information: The performance period for the sixth year of this project is from September 1, 2010 through August 31, 2011.

Changing The Equation (PD# 101003)

Wright College has received an award of \$40,000 from the National Center for Academic Transformation.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will support the redesign of developmental mathematics courses utilizing an emphasis on individualization and contextualization.

Accountability: Mr. Kevin Li, Dean of Instruction at Wilbur Wright College will be responsible for all aspects of the project including reports and presentations to NCAT.

Other Information: The final report for this project will be due on March 1, 2012.

CCC Scholarships (PD# 101008)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$167,056 to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the District to recruit and support students in fields that might lead to careers in nuclear energy.

Accountability: Mr. Michael Davis, Associate Vice Chancellor for Science, Technology and Mathematics, will be responsible for all aspects of the project including recruitment of students and providing support services.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from March 1, 2011 through February 29, 2012.

NEW AWARDS (Total Amount Awarded \$ 1,060,402)

Truman TQE and Math and Sciences Concepts Minor (PD# 101004)

Northeastern Illinois University has awarded a subcontract of \$20,000 to Truman College.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will support the consortial activities of Wright and Truman Colleges and Northeastern Illinois University for the redesign and articulation of mathematics and science courses.

Accountability: Ms. Kay McSpadden, Program and Administrative Liaison at Truman College will be responsible for all aspects of the project including marketing, promotion and recruitment.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

Wright TQE and Math and Sciences Concepts Minor (PD# 101005)

Northeastern Illinois University has awarded a subcontract of \$10,000 to Wright College.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will support the consortial activities of Wright and Truman Colleges and Northeastern Illinois University for the redesign and articulation of mathematics and science courses.

Accountability: Ms. Kay McSpadden, Program and Administrative Liaison at Truman College will be responsible for all aspects of the project including marketing, promotion and recruitment.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

Women in Nanotechnology, WIN (PD# 101006)

Truman College has received an award of \$1,000 from the US Department of Labor.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the District to recruit women and hold an orientation session for the Department of Labor's career awareness program.

Accountability: Dr. Mahesh Gurung, Professor of Biology at Truman College will be responsible for all aspects of the project.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from September 9, 2010 through November 15, 2010.

<u>Predominately Black Institutions Formula Grant Award to Olive Harvey - Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Success Program - STEM-SP (PD # 101009)</u>

Olive-Harvey College has received notice that it will be receiving an award from the US Department of Education of \$265,162.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to use learning communities and pilot a program of supplemental instruction to encourage and support a population of predominantly minority students to succeed in mathematics and science courses.

Accountability: Mr. Kevin Smith, Dean of Instruction at Olive-Harvey College will be responsible for all fiscal and programmatic aspects of the project.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011.

<u>Predominately Black Institutions Formula Grant Award to Kennedy-King College (PD # 101010)</u>

Kennedy-King College has received notice that it will be receiving an award from the US Department of Education of \$400,000.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the College to provide an array of academic support and skills development services to a targeted group of at-risk students.

Accountability: Ms. Phyllis Brooks, Dean of Instruction at Kennedy-King College will be responsible for all fiscal and programmatic aspects of the project.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011.

Predominately Black Institutions Formula Grant Award to Malcolm X College (PD # 101011)

Malcolm X College has received notice that it will be receiving an award from the US Department of Education of \$348,240.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to use the studio classroom concept to increase predominantly minority student participation and success in mathematics and the sciences.

Accountability: Ms. Lynette Stokes-Wilson, Dean of Adult Education at Malcolm X College will be responsible for all fiscal and programmatic aspects of the project.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will be from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011.

Culinary Artistry at Washburne Culinary Institute (PD# 101012)

Washburne Culinary Institute of Kennedy-King College has received an award of \$16,000 from After School Matters, an Illinois 501(c)3 not-for-profit corporation.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the District to provide after school culinary programs for children in Chicago.

Accountability: Mr. Bill Reynolds, Provost of the Washburne Culinary Institute, will be responsible for all fiscal and programmatic aspects of the project.

Other Information: The performance period for this project will include two sessions: Fall, from August 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010 and Spring, from January 1, 2011 through April 30, 2011.

CONTINUATION AWARDS (Total Amount Received \$385,067)

<u>Child Development Studies Initiative (PD# 101002 - Previously Reported as 070701-YR2)</u>

The McCormick Tribune Foundation has provided an additional award of \$85,000 (they previously awarded \$400,000) to the District Office to build on and strengthen the Child Development Studies Initiative, a district-wide effort to enhance the Child Development degree programs across the colleges. The performance period for this new phase of the project is from July 1 2010 through June 30, 2011.

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CONTINUATION AWARDS (CONT'D) [Total Amount Received \$385,067]

<u>Kennedy-King College/Dawson Technical Institute Educational Talent</u> Search (PD# 060202-YR5)

Kennedy-King College has submitted a proposal for \$300,013 to the US Department of Education for the first year of the refunding of its Talent Search grant project. The purpose of the Talent Search project will be to identify and support secondary students and out of school prospective students who might have potential for success in college. The performance period for this project is from September 1, 2006 through August 31, 2010. This project has now received an extension until August 31, 2011 and additional funding of \$300,067.
