that proposals, contracts, and other special funding instruments are under development or have been submitted by staff at this time.

NEW PROPOSALS (Total Amount Proposed \$646,647)

Safety Training Programs for Management, Leadership and Employees of Small and Medium Sized Companies (PD# 100901)

The Workforce Institute has submitted a proposal for \$249,998 for a Susan Harwood Training grant to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to serve small businesses in the Chicago area by identifying safety risk factors, establishing safety policies and providing training to assure that safety practices are utilized by all employees.

Accountability: Mr. Christopher Wilkerson, Vice President of the Workforce Institute at Harold Washington College, will be the Director of this project and will have all programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the success of the project. In this capacity he will be responsible for recruiting participants, relations with client businesses, and providing training and other services.

Other Information: The performance period for this project is from September 30, 2010 through September 29, 2011.

Chicago Center for Excellence for Veteran Student Success (PD# 100902)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$396,649 to the US Department of Education to fund a Veterans Center for the Chicago area.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to better serve veterans through recruitment, counseling, advisement and academic, career and social support.

Accountability: Mr. Michael Daigler, Vice Chancellor for Development, will be the Director of this project and will have all programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the success of the project. In this capacity, he will be responsible for hiring a project coordinator and ensuring that all proposed services are provided to veterans and that funds are spent in accordance with Federal requirements.

Other Information: The performance period for this project is from October 15, 2010 through October 14, 2013.

NEW AWARDS (Total Amount Proposed \$3,298,549)

Student Success Grant (PD# 100903)

The District has received an award from the Illinois Community College Board of \$2,824,021 to be used to increase student success at all of the colleges.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to provide services, supplemental instructional materials and auxiliary aids designed to improve retention and student learning outcomes. The project will serve students with social, economic, physical or developmental disabilities and/or other academic deficiencies that make it difficult to adapt to a college environment.

Accountability: Ms. Cynthia Armster, Associate Vice Chancellor for Student Services will be the Director of this project and will have all programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the success of the project. In this capacity, she will be responsible for developing students' eligibility criteria for the funded services and materials.

Other Information: The performance period for this project is from June 28, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

Cooperative Work Study (PD# 100904)

Harold Washington College has received funding of \$13,800 from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to support cooperative work study programs by paying a portion of the salaries that students earn while in their internship positions in business and industry.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to provide work experiences for students at participating local businesses.

Accountability: Ms. Kim Bowens, Project Coordinator, Career Programs at Harold Washington College will be the director of this project and will have all programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the success of the project. In this capacity, she will be responsible for recruiting both student participants and business partners who will provide a portion of the students' internship salaries.

Other Information: The performance period for this project is from Jan 26, 2010 until June 15, 2011.

Truman Student Support Services Grant (PD# 100905)

Truman College has received an award notice from the US Department of Education for \$226,262 to be used to provide academic and other support services to low-income, first-generation or disabled college students.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to provide services, supplemental instructional materials and auxiliary aids designed to improve retention and graduate rates for a select group of low-income, first-generation or disabled college students.

Accountability: Mr. Roberto C. Valadez, Director of Student Support Services at Truman College will be the Director of this project and will have all programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the success of the project. In this capacity, he will be responsible for selecting participating students and providing support services and program monitoring and evaluation activities.

Other Information: The performance period for the first year of this five year project is from September 1, 2010 through August 30, 2011.

Malcolm X Student Support Services Grant (PD# 100906)

Malcolm X College has received an award notice from the US Department of Education for \$234,466 to be used to provide academic and other support services to low-income, first-generation or disabled college students.

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow the City Colleges of Chicago to provide services, supplemental instructional materials and auxiliary aids designed to improve retention and graduate rates for a select group of low-income, first-generation or disabled college students.

Accountability: Ms. Tasha Williams, Dean of Student Services at Malcolm X College will be the Director of this project and will have all programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the success of the project. In this capacity he will be responsible for selecting participating students and providing support services and program monitoring and evaluation activities.

Other Information: The performance period for the first year of this five year project is from September 1, 2010 through August 30, 2011.

Adult Education -State Performance (PD# 100509)

The District Office has requested funding of \$1,043,817 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB).

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow City Colleges of Chicago to provide instructional services for Adult Basic Education and English as a Second Language at all seven colleges.

Accountability: Dr. Lizzette Richardson, Associate Vice Chancellor for Adult Education.

Other Information: The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011. This award specifically authorizes "flow-through" subcontracts with Logan Square Neighborhood Association, for \$36,653, and with 21st Century Urban Schools, for \$10,446.

Adult Education -State Basic (PD# 100508)

The District Office has requested funding of \$3,049,404 from The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB).

Benefit to the City Colleges of Chicago: This funding will allow City Colleges of Chicago to provide instructional services for Adult Basic Education and English as a Second Language at all seven colleges.

Accountability: Dr. Lizzette Richardson, Associate Vice Chancellor for Adult Education.

Other Information: The period of performance for this program is July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011. This award specifically authorizes "flow-through" subcontracts with Logan Square Neighborhood Association, for \$35,514, and with 21st Century Urban Schools, for \$10,122.
