**REPORTS** that the Fall 2009 Scholar's at Wright Lecture Series focused on Christopher Marlowe's work Doctor Faustus. The five lecture series featured five guest speakers providing a unique perspective on Marlowe's work. The series will opened with a lecture titled "Christopher Marlowe, Sensation and Scandal" by Professor Clark Hulse, of the University of Illinois at Chicago. Professor Perry Buckley, of Wright College, spoke on "Performance Aspects of Elizabethan Drama". Buckley has presented four lectures at the Globe Theater in London. Professor Richard Strier, of the University of Chicago, delivered "Faustus and English Renaissance". Professor David Bevington, of the University of Chicago, presented on the "Determinism and Free Will in Marlowe's Dr. Faustus" and Professor Wendy Doniger, of the University of Chicago, delivered the final presentation, "The Playwright's Use of Inherited Myths: Marlowe's Dr. Faustus and Shakespeare's All's Well".
