TERM:

The National Science Foundation (NSF) Grant is for the term of 2010 through 2012, with funding for three annual summer research experiences within that time frame. The specific period for FY 2011 is June 9, 2011 through July 16, 2011.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

Wilbur Wright College has been awarded a NSF grant in the amount of \$139,560 to fund summer undergraduate research in Kenya's Arabuko-Sokoke Forest for a three-year period ending summer 2012 (PD# 081005). The project will study habitat changes resulting from resource exploitation on globally threatened birds and has as its collaborator the Kenya Wildlife Service's Biodiversity and Monitoring Division. Selected Wright College students will receive hands-on training in tropical field ecology as well as the opportunity to develop research linkages important in career development.

BENEFIT TO CITY COLLEGES OF CHICAGO:

Wilbur Wright College's participation in this collaborative research project in Kenya advances the District's goals in the globalization of the curriculum, enhances- student credentials and provides opportunities for students to develop academic and research skills key in educating future generations of scientists and engineers.

Students of Wright College receive enhanced cultural and scientific learning experiences that go beyond the walls of the classroom.
