THE CHANCELLOR RECOMMENDS:

that the Board of Trustees authorizes the Chairman to execute an agreement with McGraw-Hill Education to provide an integrated computerized learning system for a three year period beginning January 2, 2012 through January 1, 2015 for an annual cost of \$150,000 and a total cost not to exceed \$450,000 for the contract term.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

The original term of this agreement will commence on January 2, 2012 and end January 1, 2015.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The services provided shall include an integrated computerized learning software that offers an extensive online library of interactive instructional courseware, providing learners and teachers with access to thousands of hours of self-paced, supplemental mastery-based instruction for the City Colleges of Chicago (CCC). Students in Adult Education will be given dashboard-like progress notices of their current skill level based on a particular career pathway, and indicators of positive progress as they proceed. The cost of this solution is based on \$30 per seat for 5000 students.

BENEFIT TO CITY COLLEGES OF CHICAGO:

The integrated computerized learning software will provide continued academic support for the Credit and Adult Education students of CCC and increase student success and retention. Its focus on career pathways will impact Adult Education and Credit students that are transitioning to workforce programs. The software provides support through learning sessions, practice sessions, pre and post-testing sessions, as well as dashboard-like progress.

VENDOR SELECTION CRITERIA:

Specifications were prepared by District Procurement staff and publicly advertised on September 2, 2011 as Request for Proposal (RFP) DT1109 –Revised Implementation of a Computerized Learning System. Said RFP was sent to 24 firms and a pre-proposal conference was conducted on September 12, 2011. Submittals were received on October 3, 2011 from eight (8) vendors: National Able Network, Grade Results, K12 Virtual Schools, EASY the ESL Series, CSC Learning, Aztec Software, Plato Learning, McGraw-Hill Education. Based on initial evaluations, the following 3 firms were selected to make “oral presentations”: Aztec Software, Grade Results, McGraw-Hill-Education-Workforce.

The firms were evaluated according to the following criteria:

1. Proposed plan of action for the execution of the requested scope of services.
2. Past Experience in providing similar services with educational institutions, government agencies or private firms
3. Fees in relation to the Scope of Services
4. M/WBE Compliance Plan

Based on the combined initial & oral presentation scores, McGraw-Hill Education was deemed most responsive.

MBE/WBE COMPLIANCE:

The Office of M/WBE Contract Compliance has reviewed the above agreement request and, McGraw-Hill, requesting a waiver of direct participation as there are no opportunities to further subcontract this product, is in compliance through indirect participation with the Board Approved Participation Plan.
