The City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) proposes the STEM Scholars program, a scholarship program for 60 undergraduate students pursuing Associates of Science (AS), Associates of Engineering Science (AES) and transfer opportunities with a concentration in STEM disciplines including Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Mathematics, Computer Science, and Engineering as well as their related fields.

The activities of this project support the National Science Foundation's S-STEM goals to increase access, retention and graduation rates at both the associate and baccalaureate degree levels, and improve support for at-risk students in STEM discipline programs. Integral components of the STEM Scholars program include: the application process, acceptance into the program, a transfer course, graduation and transfer to a four year college (4YC) and the creation of a STEM Community (a supportive community for academic, professional and community based work).
