These programs provide career awareness and internship opportunities in the culinary career fields.

In order to build awareness and excitement around the study of chemistry, the Chemical Education Foundation created the You Be the Chemist Challenge. This tournament-style competition is modeled after the national spelling bee, and features chemistry related questions. Students in participating areas compete at the local, state, and national level for prizes and scholarships.			

In Chicago, the You Be The Chemist (YBTC) Challenge contestants are drawn from students participating in after school clubs which use the Chemical Education Foundation's YBTC curriculum. CPS teachers lead students through 15-weeks of activities during the after school club to explore chemistry concepts and prepare them to compete at the Chicago You Be the Chemist Challenge, a large event featuring a quiz-bowl type competition and table based science demonstrations manned by middle school students and educators that attracts several hundred people each year. City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) has been District's partner. The development of the after school program in CPS and the partnership with CCC has helped make Chicago Public Schools a model for large-scale implementation of the YBTC program. The popularity of the YBTC program is evident: beginning in 5 schools, the program has grown to 55 school-based clubs in just four years.

Olive Harvey and Truman Colleges have received notification of funding for their secondary level charter school programs from the Youth Connection Charter School. The YCCS will provide \$1,263,348 for the Olive Harvey Middle College and \$1,195,854 for the Truman Middle College. YCCS funding will allow the District to serve 181 students at the Truman Middle College (TMC) and 185 students at the Olive Harvey Middle College. This program will help residents of the City of Chicago by providing educational services which are not available through traditional high school programs including specialized dropout retrieval counseling and tutoring support. In addition, the program will serve as a recruitment vehicle as students are prepared to matriculate into other City Colleges of Chicago programs. For example, this June, 107 TMC students graduated with a high school diploma and 72% of these graduates indicated that they plan to enroll at Truman or another of the City Colleges of Chicago following graduation. An additional 19% indicated they plan to enroll in a four-year institution. In addition, these students will improve the fiscal stability of their neighborhoods, the City of Chicago and the State of Illinois through higher earnings and higher tax contributions over their lifetimes.
