- 4) Provide a final report to the nominating institution describing Fellowship experiences, including the use of funds. The nominating institution shall submit the report to the Board on behalf of the Fellow.

Olive-Harvey College and Kennedy-King College have each received sub-awards of \$62,500 from the National Science Foundation for a project in collaboration with Chicago State University to support minority participation in Mathematics and Science. These awards will support student activities, materials and related expenses to continue a project that allows natural science students the opportunity to learn about prairie restoration and management, phytoremediation of urban brown fields, and other current issues related to natural science such as the impact urban forests have on the environment. Project activities for students will focus on developing college success skills, introduction to research, understanding of prairie and phytoremediation issues, support for student investigation and development of scientific presentation skills.
