C3TDL will provide educational programs, certificates of value and job placement services for 1000 project participants in occupations for which local employers have identified a strong need for qualified

employees. CCC, working closely with College to Careers TDL employer partners (Coyote Logistics, Schneider Finance, CTA, UPS, Union Pacific, United Airlines and others), National Able Network, Inc. (Able), the Chicago Workforce Investment Council (CWIC), and the Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce, will implement the C3TDL Project. The Truman Middle College and the Olive Harvey Middle College will receive funding from this award.

From the grant funds, the following diploma programs and GED programs will utilize subcontracts from the City Colleges of Chicago: Aspira, Inc., Association House of Chicago, Austin Career Education Center, Circle Foundation/Bronzeville Academic Center, Community Services West, Lakeview Academy, Prologue, Inc., Sullivan House, and Alternative Schools Network.
