

How Did We Increase Graduation?

Identified students with 45+ credits earned toward graduation - assisted them in registering for courses needed for graduation - a small number also took some newly designed short-term course offerings

Embedded tutoring in courses students typically struggle in, new Wellness Center and new Veterans Center helped students, re-vamped InTRUduction orientations

Case management advising aided students, and our new Math Center and Writing Center both increased success for student attendees by over 10%
