Increase the number of students earning college credentials of economic value. Dramatically improve outcomes for students requiring remediation; Increase the number and share of ABE/GED/ESL students who advance to and succeed in college-level courses; Increase rate of transfer to bachelor's degree programs following graduation from CCC; Increase quality and effectiveness of student services and support.

Summary

The Title III – Strengthening Institutions Program would implement full learning communities for entering students with remedial needs. Students would commit to full-time enrollment during the academic year and summer enrollment. The academic support would be embedded in the first year with specialists who teach the college success course and would act as the go-to person for the cohort. Upon the students' completion of their first year of college, students would be assigned to a Completion Advisor. This project would help students to complete remedial English and enter a bona-fide program of study and/or earn 30 college-level credit hours. This would provide a firm foundation for college completion by:

- Fully implementing Writing and Math Success Centers (Current Pilots).
- Library Improvement: Updating student computers used for projects and assignments, integrating instructional technology and improving information literacy instruction, and bring learning resources up-to-date to reflect current knowledge.

Summary

The focus of this project is to clarify the academic pathway to calculus that prepares students for successful attainment of an A.S. degree and/or transfer to STEM programs at baccalaureate-granting institutions. Activities include:

- Creating a supported student pathway
- Providing excellent academic instruction
- Building community
- Supporting the creative scholarship

These activities would increase persistence from high school to college, from the first to second year of college, and to A.S. degree attainment and will increase transfer rates for students in the STEM pipeline.
