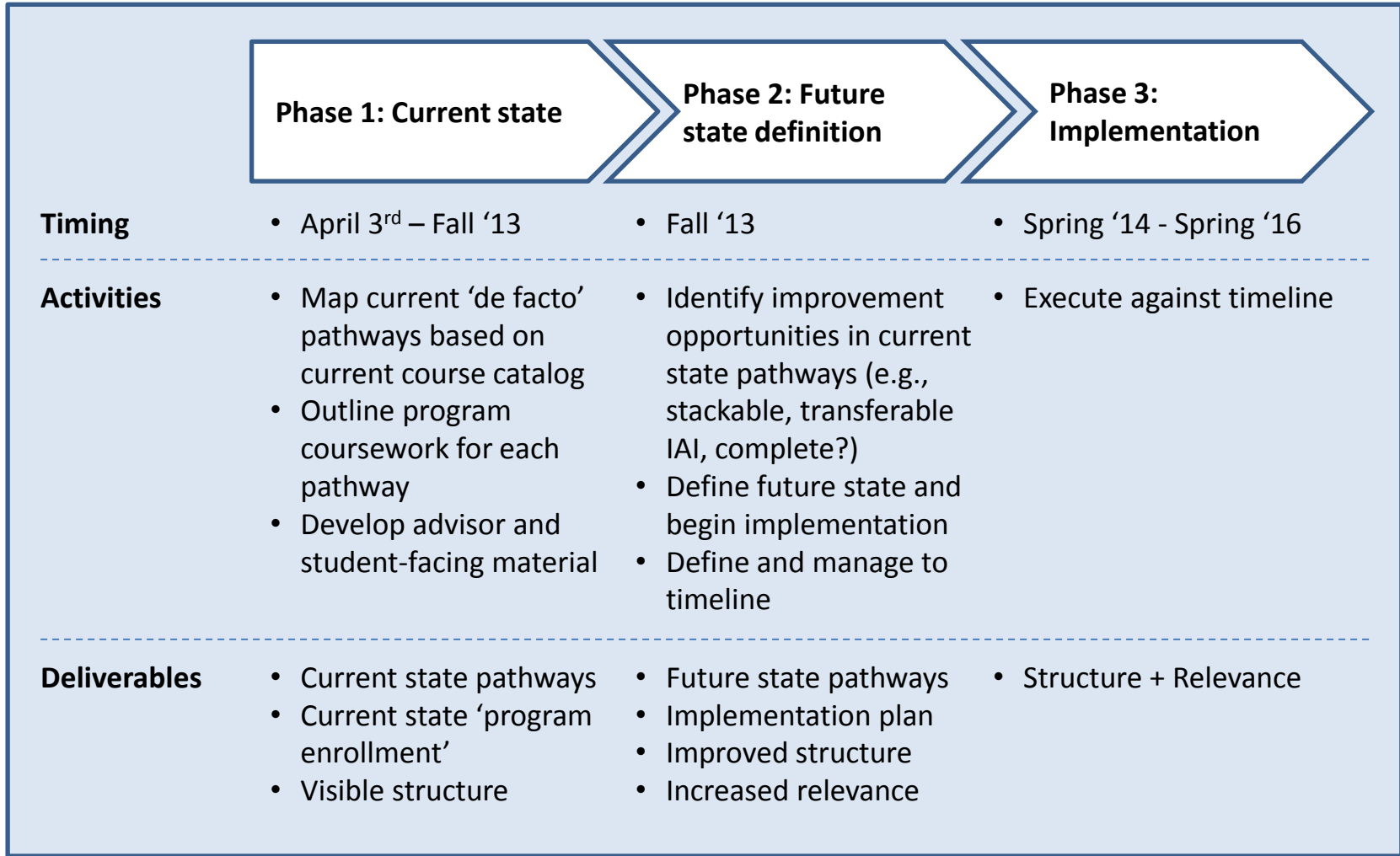

High level workplan for Reinvention⁷

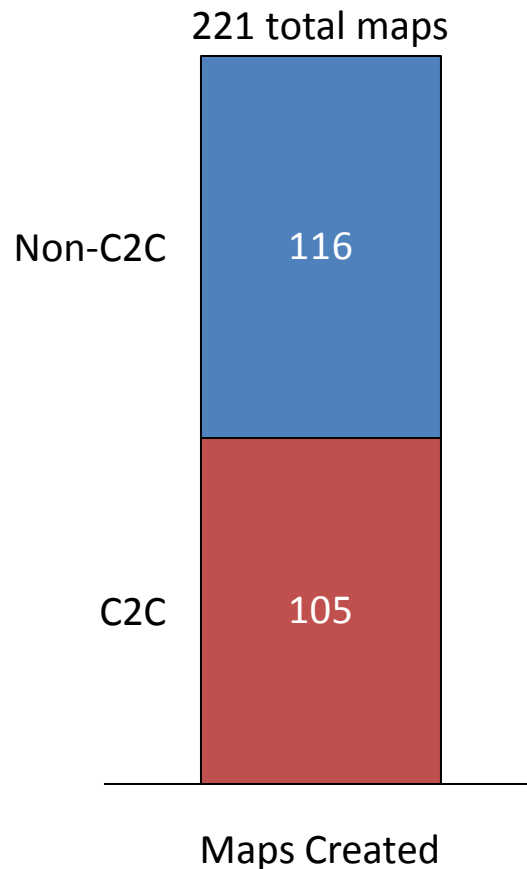

Creation



Path forward for completing pathways work

Validate

- Continue validation by faculty over the summer/fall
- We want maps in hands of advisors and students this registration cycle for validated maps

Standardize

- Categorize similar maps so students can easily pivot if they change their mind
- Standardize layout and narrative text

Improve

- Ensure full alignment with already available Fall schedules (and plan for coming terms)
- Improve curriculum and program offering

Culinary Arts: BC, AC, AAS 5/2/2013

The A.A.S. degree program in Culinary Arts is a sequential learning program taught over four semesters. All semesters include lecture, discussion, demonstration and hands-on production that allow students to practice the techniques of food production in a commercial food service environment. The curriculum includes additional methods and techniques that will increase the student's repertoire of ethnic and classical menus. In addition, the coursework will include management skills, cost control, budgeting techniques, merchandising, business planning, resume writing and interviewing techniques. General Education classes must be completed to satisfy the degree requirements. Students will receive the ServSafe® Sanitation Certification and will be eligible for the City of Chicago and State of Illinois Sanitation certificates upon completion.

Relevance: Overview of issues regarding catalog transparency and pathway length/transferability

Catalog Transparency: Some programs have numerous “hidden” pre-requisites not listed under program requirements, nor included in cumulative credit hours totals

Example: CAD AAS has 5 invisible pre-req’s that make the program a minimum of 76 credits

- ✓ **Fix:** Work with Academic Affairs to quick-fix catalog issues uncovered by documenting current-state, so no student is misled into thinking a degree will take shorter time

Pathway Length: Many programs are too long, in terms of ch’s, semesters and financial aid required.

Example: There are BC’s that take 3 semesters to complete and AC’s that take 5 (times of course offering and pre-reqs)

- ✓ **Fix:** Start with C2C programs, where we are often ahead of these issues; have Reinvention⁷ teams work with faculty to improve student learning outcomes and their sequences.

Transferability: Although a helpful guide, Illinois Articulation Initiative courses are only a start and not as relevant as a four year’s transfer guide.

- ✓ **Potential solution:** Starting this summer, we will use the transfer semester-by-semester maps to create new, CCC-wide articulation agreements (course by course and degree program articulation)
 - We will start with the institutions that enroll and graduate most of our students.
 - We will start with C2C programs.
