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FCCCC President's Address CCC Board of Trustee's Meeting Thursday, May 2, 2013

- 7) And soon I'll be leaving to join colleagues in Minnesota for the CUR conference, and I would just like to say Vice President Margie Martyn has been fantastic in helping coordinate this event. We have faculty from all 7 colleges with flights booked, cell phone numbers exchanged, briefing meetings, and dinner plans arranged. Our hope is to come back with ideas and possibilities for new learning opportunities for our students throughout CCC.
- 8) I leave for this trip Joyful and hopeful about new possibilities. And that is the way it should be in an educational institution. Learning should be joyful. School should be joyful.
