Chapter 1 or SGSA (Supplemental General State Aid) is a state grant that provides support for low income students (students who qualify for free or reduced lunch). Funding from this grant would be used to provide academic support and remediation, as well as reduce class size, improve attendance, and provide after school enrichment activities. Olive Harvey Middle College would receive \$115,668 and Truman Middle College would receive \$106,596 in grant funds.

Summary

Referred to as "Tuition", this grant would be funded by Youth Connection Charter Schools. The grant amount is determined by "tuition per seat". OHMC would receive funds for 185 seats at an allocation of \$6550 per student for a total of \$1,205,200 while Truman would receive \$1,375,500 for 210 seats at \$6550 per student allocation. This grant would provide support for the middle colleges' entire operational costs including administrative, instructional, and support staff costs. This grant would also provide assistance for instructional supplies, professional development, student activities, and dual enrollment.

This grant supports school improvement initiatives to increase student performance in reading and math so that schools benchmark at an "adequate yearly progress". Funds from this grant would be used to pay a portion of staff (within school improvement) as well as provide professional development, and supplemental student materials in the instructional areas of reading and math. Olive-Harvey Middle College would receive \$47,801 and Truman would receive \$22,062 in grant funds.
