RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE RELOCATION OF CITY COLLEGES OF CHICAGO PROGRAMS
EFFECTIVE JANUARY 2016

WHEREAS, Malcolm X College educational programs require approval of the Board of Trustees of Community College District No. 508, the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB), and the Illinois Board of Higher Education;

WHEREAS, an application for relocation and permanent approval of City Colleges of Chicago School of Health Sciences Programs, including Basic Certificate, Advanced Certificate and Associate Degree Programs as described in Exhibit A, has been received and has been appropriately reviewed for submission;

WHEREAS, the new citywide City Colleges of Chicago School of Health Sciences at Malcolm X College will build on the best practices across all health sciences and healthcare occupational programs and combine instructional talent and resources such as a virtual hospital, state of the art technology, exposure to teacher practitioners from leading healthcare employers and access to clinical rotations at major local hospitals and healthcare providers;

WHEREAS, the goal of the School of Health Sciences at Malcolm X College will be to continue to deliver exceptional educational opportunities to a culturally and ethnically diverse population of students at City Colleges of Chicago while striving to enhance student's knowledge and application of skill, improve collaborate service learning and promote life-long learning by providing a broad range of quality, affordable courses, programs, and service to prepare students with credentials of economic value; and

WHEREAS, the School of Health Sciences is committed to ensuring that: 1) educational programming is delivered in a "stackable" program sequence adhering to the College to Careers implementation model; 2) each unique program sequence meets the Illinois Community College Board standard for submission for approval of career and technical education programs; 3) the curriculum was developed through a collaborative effort of faculty and industry partnerships; and 4) student learning outcomes are reflective of employer needs;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Community College District No. 508, County of Cook and State of Illinois, hereby approves the relocation of these programs listed in Exhibit A to the new School of Health Sciences at Malcolm X College and the submission of these programs for permanent approval by the Illinois Community College Board and Illinois Board of Higher Education.
