<b>Summary</b> WYCC was invited to apply for a renewal MacArthur Foundation General Operating Support grant in the amount of \$52,500/yearly (\$262,500   5 yrs.). WYCC would engage 5-6 student interns to assist with pre- and post-production activities and administrative duties. This project would increase potential opportunities to acquire new memberships and revenues for the station. The funds would be used for general operating activities, which would include but not be limited to: staff, production, planning meetings/refreshments, marketing materials, equipment and supplies.

Increase the number of students earning college credentials of economic value. Increase the quality and effectiveness of student services and support.
<b>Summary</b>
This project would improve alignment with Chicago Public Schools (CPS) and CCC. Students earn college credit and would be able to experience Early College opportunities while they attend high school. This grant would allow CCC to better improve outreach to high schools and curriculum alignment efforts with Career and Technical Education (CTE) Programs of Study (POS). Faculty and staff would be able to participate in professional development opportunities that closely relate to their field.

Strategically align community and special interest programming with community need.
<b>Summary</b>
WYCC was selected among four television markets -- Chicago, Pittsburgh, Atlanta and Washington to participate in the August Wilson Education Outreach Campaign. The purpose of the theatre-based initiative is to connect youth with leading Chicago theatre and arts organizations to enhance conversations about their own communities based on the themes reflected in the award winning work of playwright August Wilson. As a companion outreach project for the national PBS documentary series, "August Wilson: The Ground on Which I Stand," this funding would provide WYCC with the opportunity to support a supplemental educational project for high school students, encouraging the development of creative writing skills through instructional sessions on writing poems and theatre monologues that reflect portraits of everyday life. Using the themes of August Wilson, students would create projects that reflect on their community as roadwork to connecting them with the passionate impact of words in telling powerful stories. In February 2015, PNC Bank will host a screening of the PBS documentary and students participating in the educational outreach project would have the opportunity to participate in a showcase of their work, prior to the movie screening.
