### Summary

The Northeastern Illinois University and Wright College Consortium for Teacher Education in Middle School Math, Science and Technology Concepts (MSTQE) was an outcome of a federal Teacher Quality Enhancement Grant given to the State of Illinois. Wright College has been working with Northeastern Illinois University for over ten years through a joint bridge program, MSTQE (Middle School Teaching of Math and Science). This program is designed for students interested in elementary education who seek an endorsement to teach mathematics and science at the middle school level.

The MSTQE program serves approximately 50 students each fiscal year from Wright. This bridge program aims to increase transfer rates between Wright College and Northeastern Illinois University, mainly in the area of

middle-school teaching education, aligning with Reinvention Goals 1-3.

The money from the grant would be used to reimburse the college for funds used to support two faculty members' who receive release time to coordinate and teach at Northeastern Illinois University.

ComEd has donated two electric line material handling/bucket trucks to the Overhead Line Worker Program at Dawson Technical Institute. The trucks have an estimated value of \$150,000.
