Increase the number of students earning college credentials of economic value. Strategically align community and special interest programming with community need.			
Summary			
Truman College would create the Educational Design Lab, a series of three courses for educators that would reinforce traditional science content from the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) core curriculum with design and engineering practices that educators are typically lacking. The proposed courses would emphasize: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design Principles – how to move from a problem to a solution • Electronics Principles – how to make, test, and refine functional electronic devices • Analysis Principles – how to use desktop computers and web interfaces for powerful data collection and analysis <p>Funds from this grant would be used to support the cost of materials and subsidize the cost of courses for 150 educators from 20 high schools and 70 middle schools in the Chicago area over the course of a year. Each course will be aligned with NGSS, and would focus on the Science and Engineering Practices related to specific content areas. Upon completion of all three courses, educators would receive a professional certificate that is equivalent to three college credit hours. Truman would collect evaluation data on each of the courses and refine them as they are offered throughout the year. At the conclusion of the year, Truman would present results through local and national conferences, and continue to offer the courses as part of our general operations in teacher professional development.</p>

Increase the quality and effectiveness of student services and support.			
Summary			
This grant would fund a pilot of proven financial and income support/benefits counseling services exclusively to CCC students. Truman would be the pilot site and the program would support at least 150 students with one on one financial literacy using the Center for Working Families (CWF)/Financial Opportunity Center (FOC) model. This			

model focuses on coaching, goal setting and includes 3 core integrated services:

- Financial counseling (credit building, household budgeting)
- Income supports counseling (Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) Child Care, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF))
- Job placement

The two main goals of this program would be:

- To increase student financial literacy in order to increase student retention and completion
- To equip students with the financial management skills needed to successfully manage their student loan repayment upon graduation

In addition to funding staff to deliver the financial literacy counseling services, this grant would also fund the purchase of a robust data system to track outcomes, which in combination with current CCC data systems, would enable tracking of student financial outcomes, as well as student retention and completion.

Transfer of funds from the CCC General Funds and/or Agency Accounts to the City Colleges of Chicago Foundation

Article 1, Section 1.12.10 of the Board Policies and Procedures Manual for the City Colleges of Chicago provides that the College Business Office shall establish an Agency account for each individual student organization to account for the deposits of funds collected during their fund raising activities and to account for the disbursements to pay for related expenses from those accounts;

In the past, there were funds received and recorded in the Agency or CCC accounts that were intended for the City Colleges of Chicago Foundation for the purpose of scholarships or support for CCC programs; and
