Alignment Increase the number of students earning college credentials of economic value.			
Summary The Workforce Academy (WFA) seeks funding to implement Healthcare and Hospitality Management Certifications for Underserved Populations. This grant funding would allow WFA to broaden opportunities and reach underserved populations from several Chicago inner-city neighborhoods including Englewood, Roseland, Garfield Park and Austin. The Hospitality Management Program is a six week program and provides four certification opportunities: (1) Customer Service; (2) Hospitality and Restaurant Management; (3) Hospitality Human Resource Management; (4) Illinois/Chicago Food Safety Manager Certification; as well as one credential opportunity for students with 800 hours of work-related experience (Manage First Professional). Training would be delivered four hours per day, four days per week. The Patient Care Technician Program lasts twelve weeks, and provides four certification opportunities: (1) Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), (2) Certified Phlebotomy Technician (CPT), (3) Certified Cardiographic Technician (CCT) and (4) Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certificate. To increase participants' chances of securing employment after completing their selected certification courses, the program includes 16 hours of workforce readiness training.

Strategically align community and special interest programming with community need; Increase the number of students earning college credentials of economic value;

Summary

This funding must be aligned with the colleges Perkins program of study. Funds received from the New Look project would be used at Daley to host an "Occupational/Workforce" fair during spring 2014 term where 300 to 500 students would participate. Non-traditional and special population groups would be targeted for participation, including females for non-traditional occupations and ESL participants. Students would be allowed the opportunity to meet with an academic and financial aid advisor advisors. Funds received from the New Look project would be dedicated to providing resources for students from special populations; low-income and first generation college students to reinforce career exploration and soft skill acquisition at Olive-Harvey. 40-50 students would participate in the workshops. This grant would provide travel funds for students and faculty to present on the information acquired at workshops at the New Look Project Showcase in Bloomington, IL.

Summary			
The Joyce Awards grant would help fulfill the station's mission to enrich, enlighten, entertain and engage diverse communities and increase the development, production and airing of cultural diverse programs. This grant would assist in developing community partner relationships and promoting cultural awareness through the arts and increase the station's membership. Every year Over 200 youth (ages 12 to 18) participate in the Fernando Jones Blues Camp. Grant funds would be used for Pre and Post-Production costs to professionally produce a series highlighting Fernando Jones composed blues piece "The Era of Blues" performed by the Fernando Jones Blues Camp participants.
