



CALLS FOR SERVICE CY2012 VS. CY2013






Safety and Security has been partnering with the colleges to provide safe teaching and learning environments at all times




Increases in Illness/Injury and Fire Alarm incidents and reductions in Disturbances and Policy Violations appear linked to new reporting standards and better campus collaboration





Theft of personal property, notably electronic devices, is the highest reported crime, and an awareness campaign has been launched to address this issue





Our goal for FY 2015 is to reduce crime that occurs on CCC owned/leased property by 2 percent

We will continue to expand the following successful security strategies

- Turnstiles as an effective deterrent
- Bicycle and mobile patrols for better visibility
- Timely warnings to communicate incidents or threats
- Staff training on priority topics (i.e. mandatory reporting, CPR/AED, etc.)
- Emergency drills every semester
- Greater interaction with students
- Consistent District-wide brand in security officer attire









A new Communications Security System will improve the safety of CCC students, faculty, staff and visitors at all campuses.

Key Elements

- •Reduction of 'dead zones' and ensures constant communication.
- •CCC Safety and Security staff will have the ability to communicate district wide.
- •CCC Safety and Security staff will have the ability to communicate with local first responders.
- •Current radios will be redistributed to other CCC staff for use.
- Completion by January 2015





CCC has undertaken a security camera review and upgrades across all campuses

Key Elements

- Reviewing camera positioning for smarter coverage and visibility.
- Camera upgrades will result in sharper, clearer picture quality.
- Better accessibility to camera viewing, retrieval of footage and storage.
