Faculty from Harold Washington College would work with Chemistry faculty from DePaul University to help build a student/faculty learning community around scholarship and curriculum development in high altitude ballooning (HAB). HAB is an accessible and affordable way to integrate undergraduate research into the classroom, engage students, and improve the scientific thinking skills critical for success in the workplace. 16 CCC faculty members would be trained in HAB, and able to provide training to other faculty members to use this technique in their classroom and engage students. Funds received would be used for faculty stipends, supplies and materials, and travel to professional meetings.

Summary

This grant would support funding for a summer to academic year bridge program that provides intervention for high school juniors and seniors who place below college level math. This grant would provide students with academic support by offering math remediation prior to enrollment in college credit classes as well as non-academic student support services. Harold Washington College would receive \$50,000 in funding, Olive-Harvey College \$50,000 in funding and Wilbur Wright College would receive \$30,000 in funding to support their programs.
