## **Summary**

Head Start is a federally funded program that promotes school readiness to children ages 3-5. The program would subsidize the cost of programs at Daley, Malcolm X, Truman, Kennedy-King and Olive- Harvey. The Child Development Laboratory Schools support student success by reducing barriers to student's enrollment and retention: offering quality early learning care services to the children of CCC students.

#### Summary

This pilot would impact the first cohort of Human Development and Family Studies (HDFS) students, approximately 30 students. Upon completing their AAS degree in HDFS, CCC students would be eligible for the Family Specialist credential which would benefit them when applying for employment. The projected

outcomes and objectives are - to align coursework with the proposed Gateways to Opportunities Family Specialist\knowledge/skills/dispositions and benchmarks and to ensure the academic program continues to align with the benchmarks of the Gateways to Opportunity Family Specialist Credential. Grant funds would be used to pay for faculty stipends.

## **Summary**

WYCC PBS Chicago was invited by the Dr. Scholl Foundation to submit a project proposal for a walk-a-thon and health fair to build momentum and engage the community in developing healthy lifestyles. Whole Foods Market will open a new store in the Englewood community in 2016. WYCC and Washburne Culinary Institute would make advancements toward educating and engaging the community prior to this opening. One of the projects to be implemented would be the WYCC Kids Club "Walk for Health" fair in the summer/fall 2015. This event would provide activities for the entire family including healthy eating presentations from Washburne and the local Whole Foods Market. This project would allow WYCC and Washburne to interact with the local community promoting educational initiatives. WYCC would engage 4-5 student interns to assist with the preand post-activities. This project would increase potential opportunities to acquire new memberships and revenues for the station. The funds would be used for general operating activities.

#### Summary

Hope College invited City Colleges of Chicago to partner with them to help build a student/faculty learning community around undergraduate research. This grant would provide students with authentic research opportunities in the Physical Science disciplines. These opportunities have been shown to increase student retention, success, and degree completion. Funds would be used to pay student tuition and stipends, faculty stipends, supplies, materials, and travel to professional meetings.

## Summary

The SENCER grant would support Truman by providing professional development training and aid in developing coursework and curriculum for students taking blocked English/Science courses. The science courses would focus on integrating reading/writing/science so that English students would be able to develop their science proficiency prior to moving into C2C programs. Grant funds would be used for faculty stipends, student out-of-class experiences and travel to SENCER conferences.
