WYCC PBS Chicago will host a pre-screening of the film for veterans and their families, an audience of diverse communities from across Chicagoland and WYCC members to share the personal stories of disabled veterans featured in the program. Funds received from this grant would also be used to support 4-6 CCC students and station interns to provide support for activities and community outreach projects related to this programming.

Summary

The Wright College Science Internship, a new project for Wright College, is a five-year program that would be funded through a grant from Wells Fargo Bank. Funds received would be used to provide two (2) 12-week paid summer science internships annually for students through an existing partnership with The Field Museum of Natural History. Working under the supervision of staff members from one of the largest natural history museums in the world, students would gain knowledge in database management, digital imaging, specimen curation, DNA extraction and sequencing. This opportunity would expose students to laboratory work at a world renowned research institution, and encourage them to either transfer to a four-year institution to pursue a career in science, or prepare students to move into well-paying laboratory jobs.

Summary

University of Massachusetts Boston, with the City Colleges of Chicago as a sub-awardee, has submitted a five-year renewal grant proposal for the Broadening Advanced Technological Education Connections (BATEC) Program. As the CCC BATEC site, Wright College would use these funds to continue to expand its Information Technology Program including: new program and course development; curriculum updates based on industry feedback/discussions with 4-year institutions regarding student transfers; and faculty professional development training. Funds from this grant could also be used for the purchase of updated classroom tools and technology equipment.
