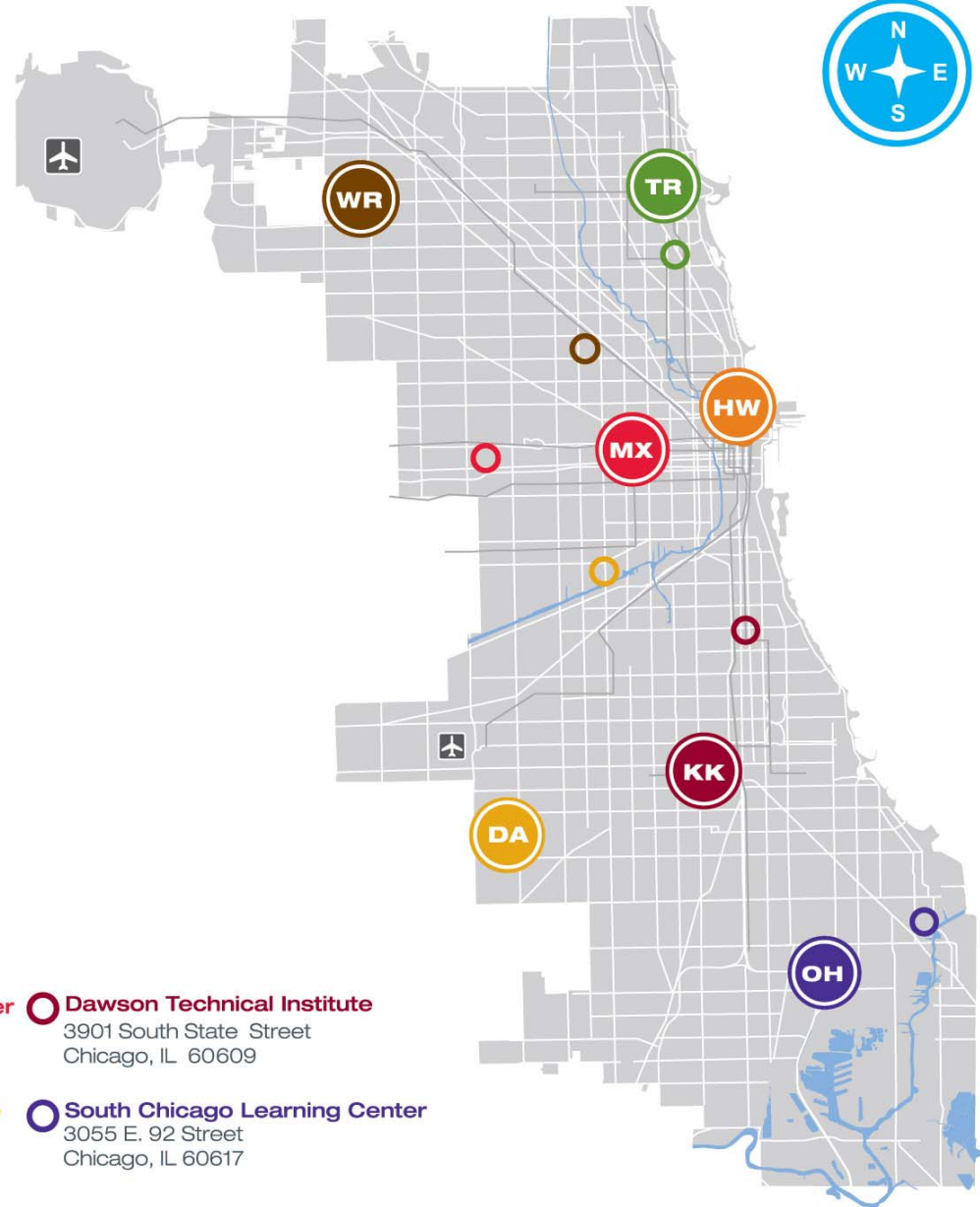

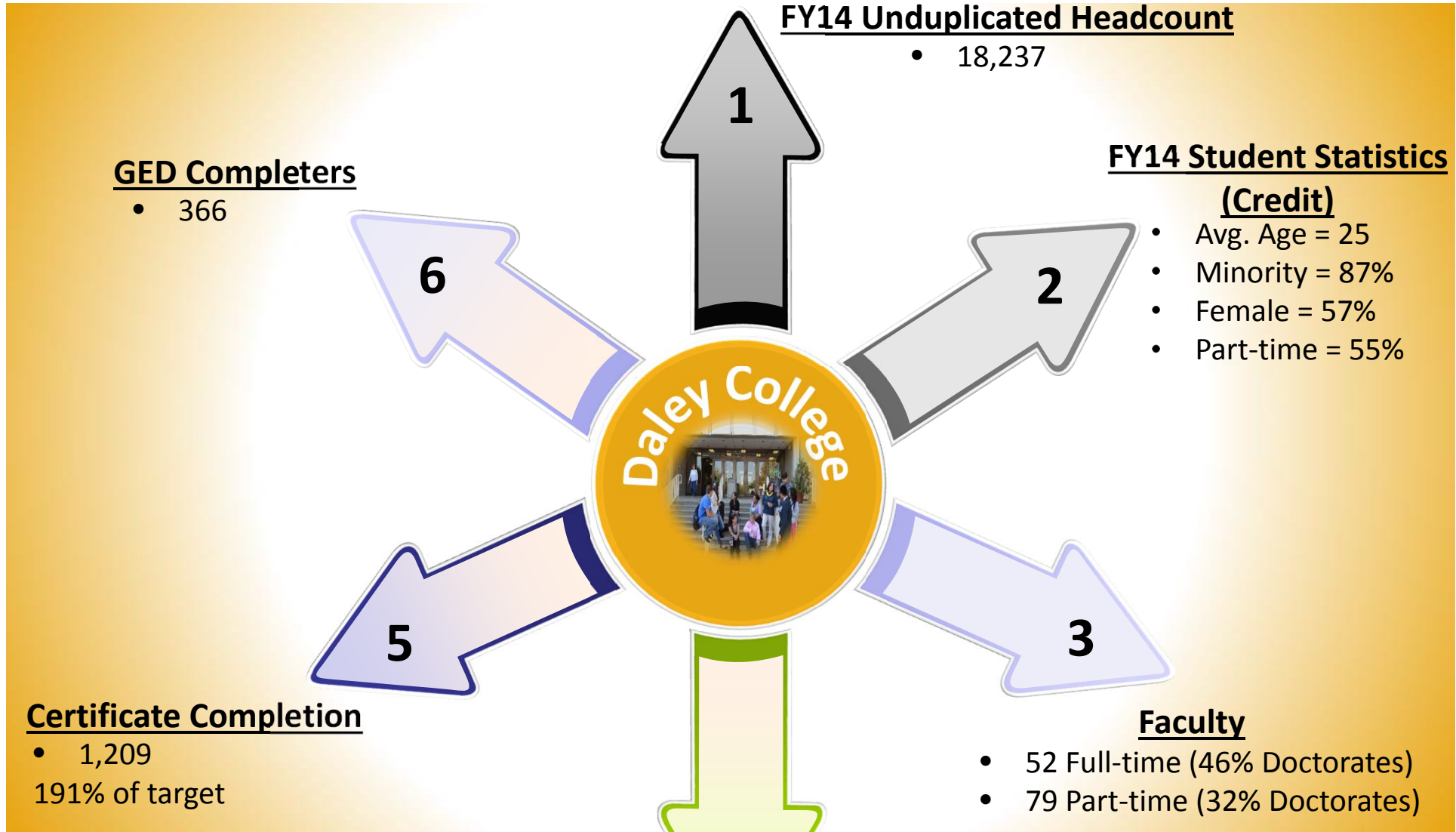

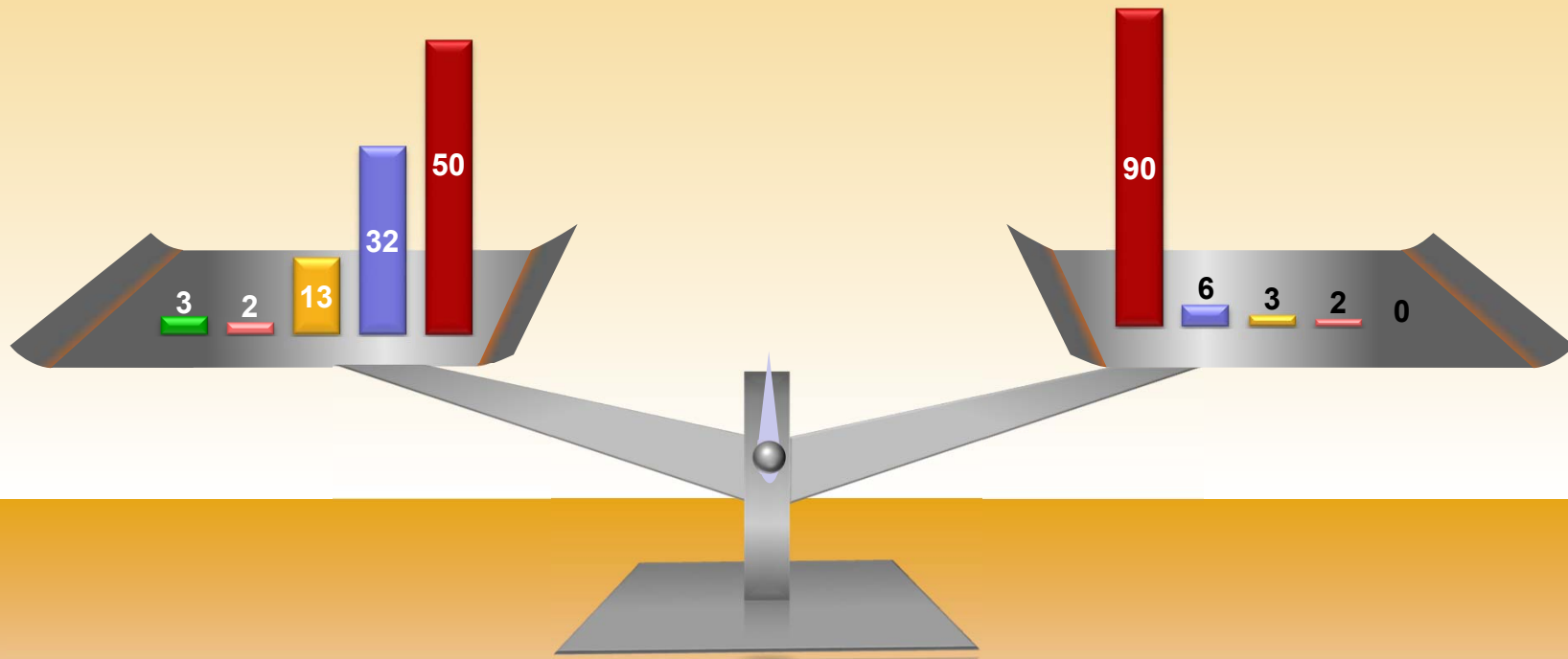

College Credit (N=7,381)

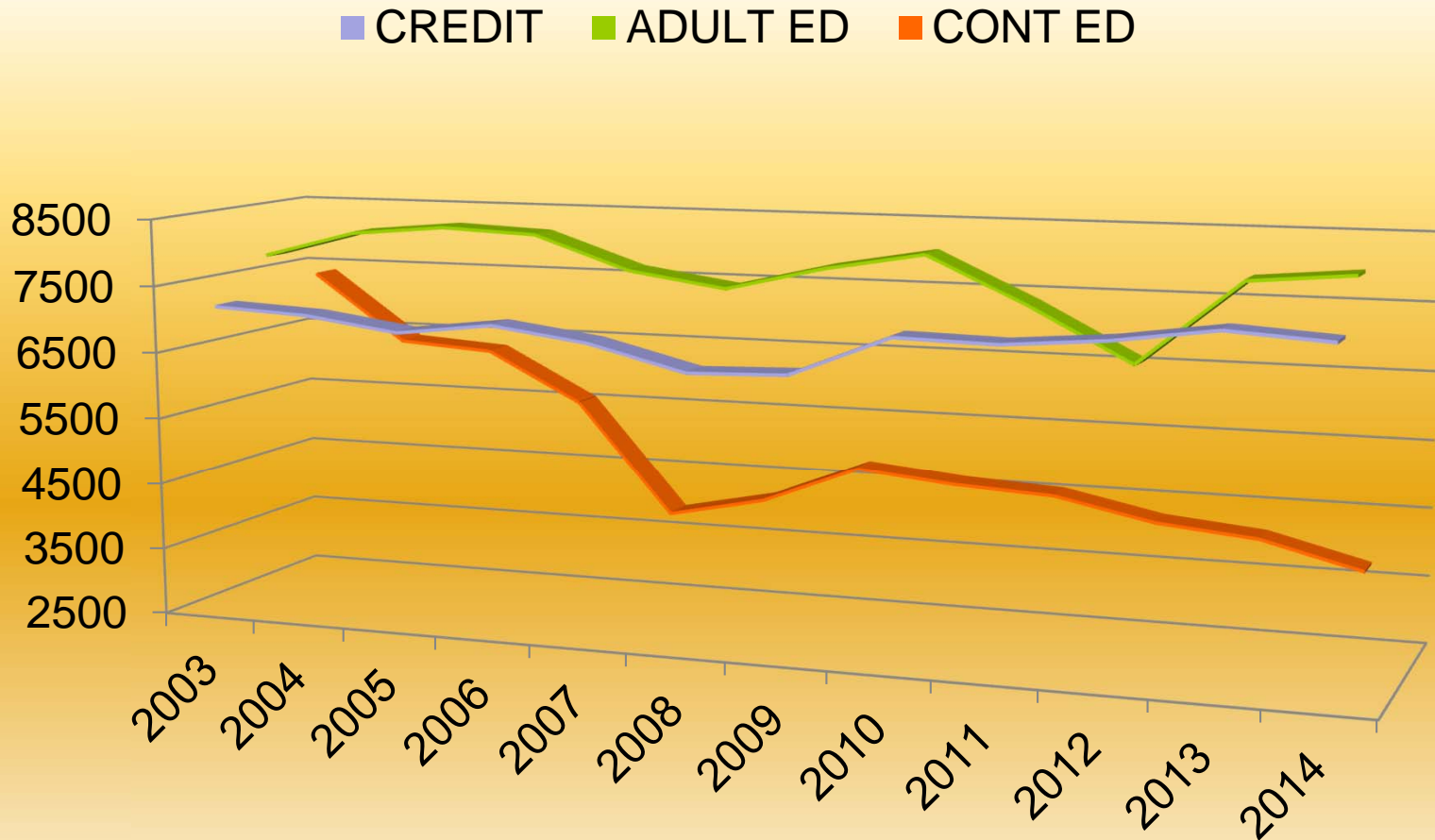

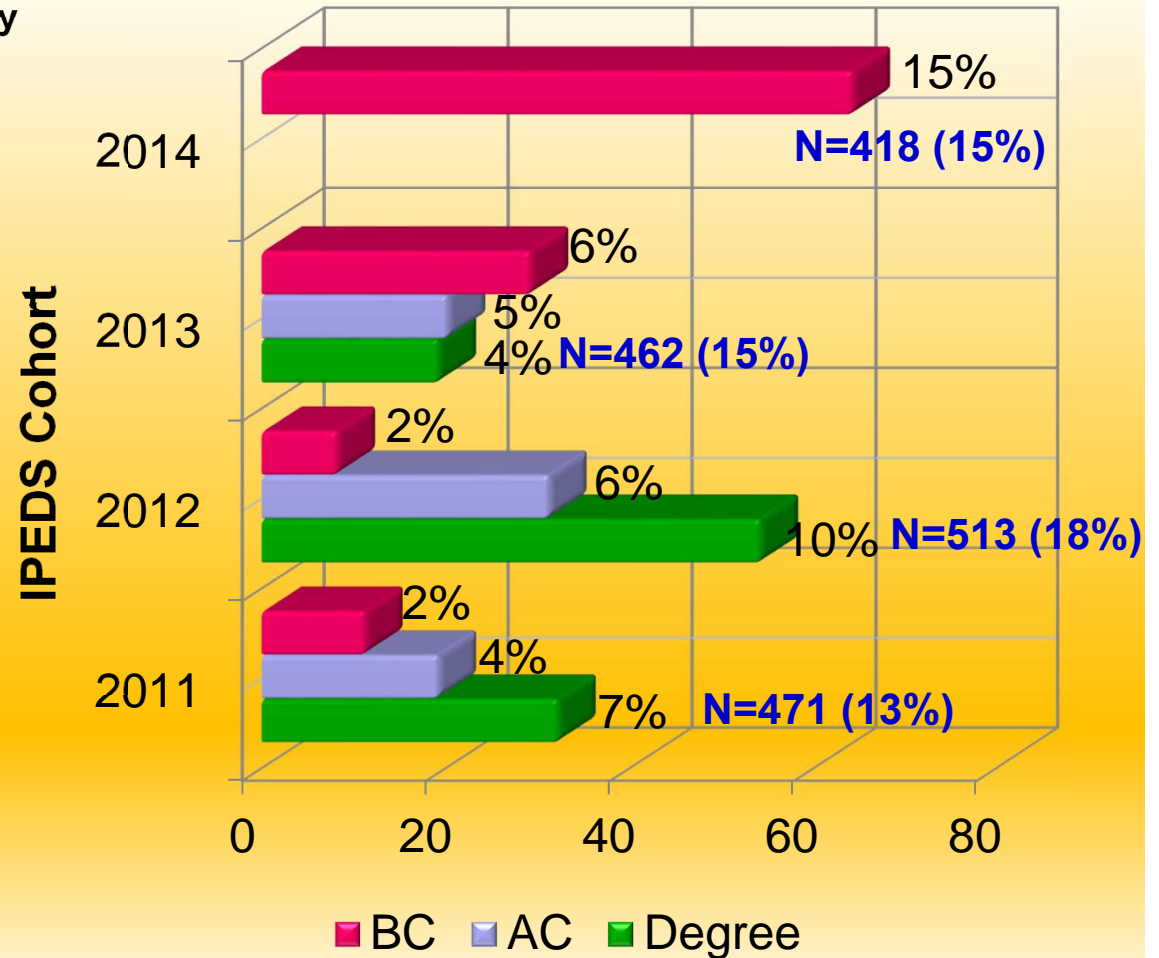
✓ Preliminary data shows IPEDS target will be exceeded for FY15

FY 14 – Early College Initiative

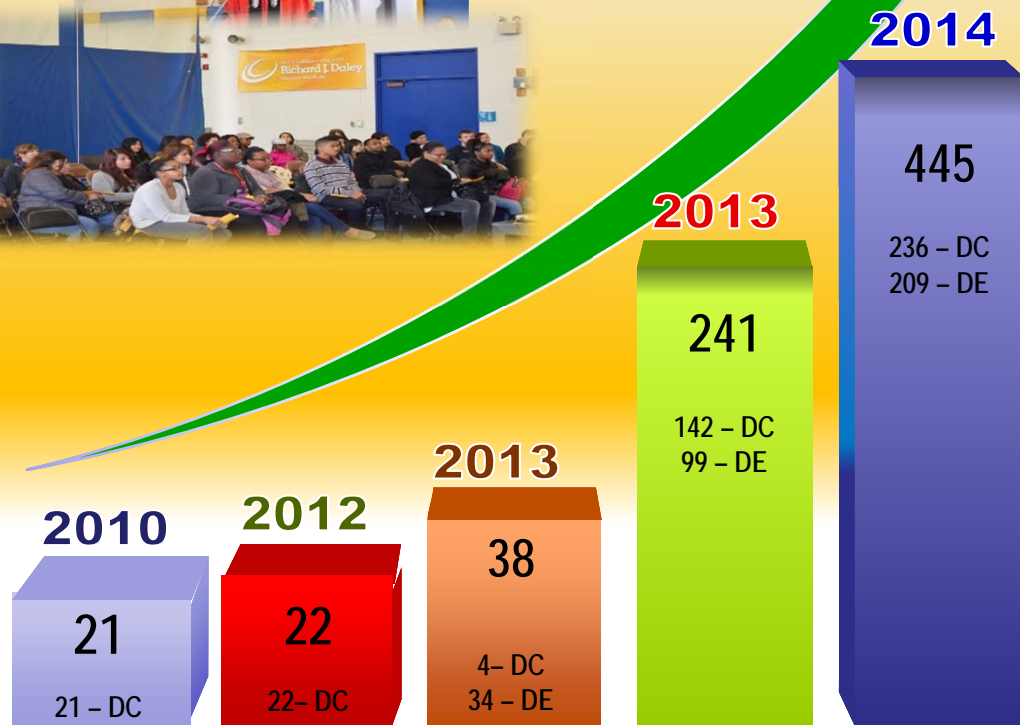
✓ Continued growth in Early College enrollment

 - World Language HS

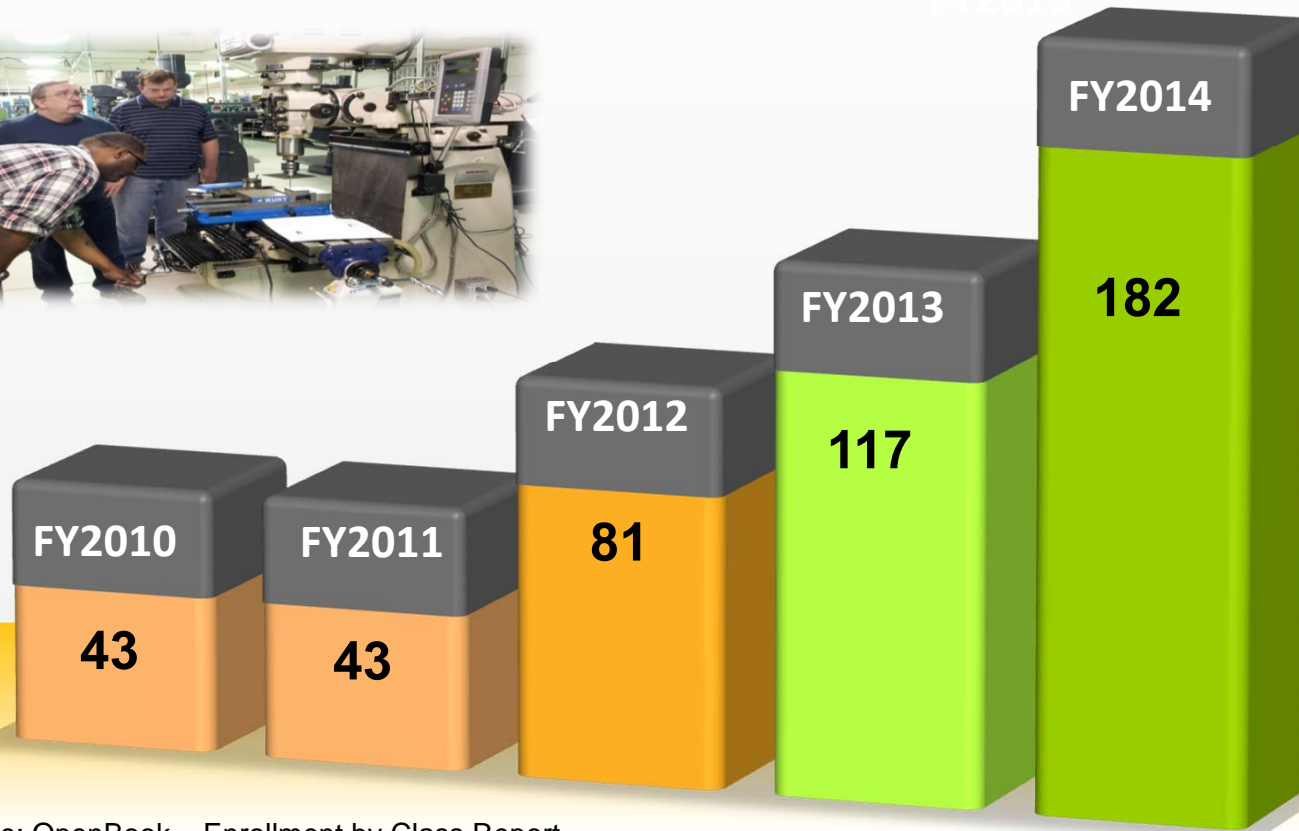

✓ **21% increase in unduplicated students between FY2013 and FY2014**

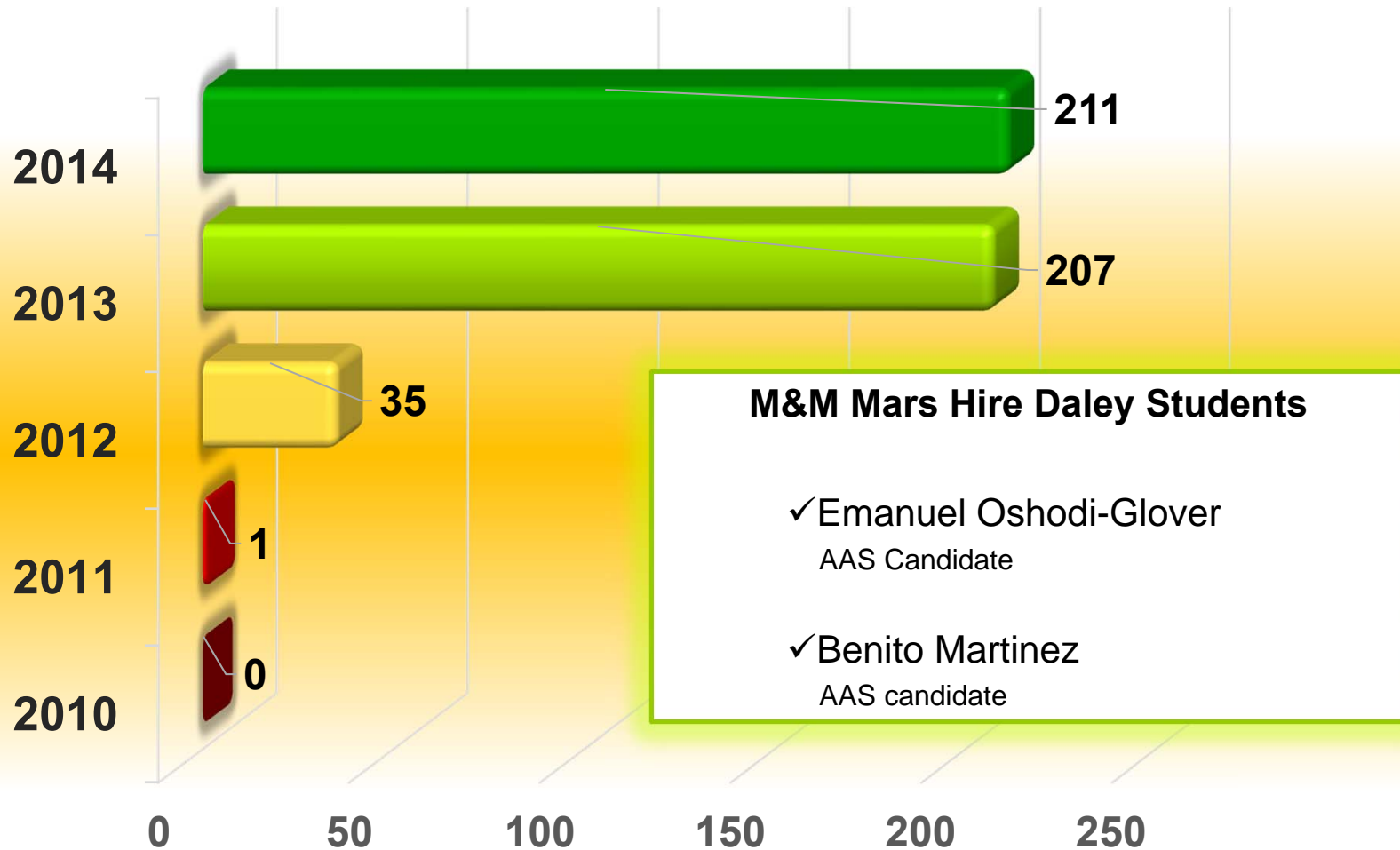
- ✓ **Increased the number of unique students taking manufacturing courses by 323% between FY10 and FY14**
