This continuation grant supports high school dropouts between the ages of 16 and 21 whose Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) reading score is at or above the 9.0 grade level equivalency. It provides assistance to students in the preparation and completion of the GED examination or earning alternative high school credit toward graduation; workforce employability skills preparation classes; preparation for employment through school-based and/or work-based learning opportunities and assistance to transition to post-secondary Career and Technical Education programs within one of the 16 nationally recognized career clusters, specifically those identified as high growth sector needs within the geographic area.

Summary

This continuation grant with the Board of Education of the City of Chicago serves at-risk students who are residents of the City of Chicago and are enrolled in City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) Child Development Laboratory Schools.

At-risk children are those whose home and community environments expose them to challenges with regards to language, culture and economic barriers which may put them at-risk for academic failure. The Chicago Board of Education evaluates students enrolled in CCC Child Development Laboratory Schools and determines eligibility for those who may benefit from the program.

Students, at a minimum, must meet an income eligibility threshold of 185% of the Federal Poverty Level. The grant amount and number of students served each year is determined by the number of students who qualify for the program. Total funding is estimated at \$884,000 for FY17, with \$740,000 designated for 3-5 year olds and \$144,000 for 2 year olds.

Summary

The FY17 Carl Perkins, IV Postsecondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) Improvement Act of 2006 program is a recurring grant for City Colleges of Chicago. Utilizing funds from the U.S. Department of Education, this project is designed to improve student performance in career and technical education by way of:

Strengthening the connections between secondary and postsecondary education; Restructuring the way stakeholders - high schools, community colleges, universities, business and parents - work together; Increasing state and local accountability standards.

The Programs of Study (POS) incorporate all of the critical aspects of CTE: academic standards, CTE skills, a progression from secondary to postsecondary education, and a recognized credential. The term POS was a compromise between using career pathways and model sequence of courses.

- Incorporate secondary and postsecondary education elements;
- Include coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant career and technical content in a coordinated, non-duplicative progression of courses that align secondary and postsecondary education to adequately prepare students to succeed in postsecondary education;
- May include the opportunity for secondary education students to acquire postsecondary education credits, including through dual or concurrent enrollment; and
- Lead to an industry-recognized postsecondary credential, certificate, associate degree, or baccalaureate degree.

Students who complete a POS are expected to be prepared for either employment or advanced education.
