Summary

This Early Head Start Child Care Partner Grant (EHSCCP) is a continuation of the EHSCCP grant that was funded by the Chicago Department of Family and Support Services in January of this year. With this increase in funding, the Department of Family and Support Services (DFSS) would select additional Early Head Start staff to receive DFSS scholarships to enroll in courses at the City Colleges of Chicago (CCC). We anticipate working with a total of 20-30 Early Head Start teachers (who serve a target population of students from birth to three years of age) and City Colleges of Chicago students.

CCC's Human Services/Child Development Associate (CDA) Department provides training for the Chicago Department of Family and Support Services to ensure that Early Head Start Program staff/CCC students meet the employment and professional development requirements for their positions as defined in the Head Start Re-authorization Act.

Our goals are to (1) increase the number of qualified teaching staff in the City of Chicago Early Head Start Programs and (2) increase the number of college students earning a credential of economic value in early childhood education and (3) provide training to assist Early Head Start teaching staff in earning 15 hours of required training per year.

Teaching staff are approved to earn (A) a CDA credential/national Early Childhood Credential (B) Gateways Credential/state-based Early Childhood Credential. All Early Head Start teachers who serve the target

population of students from birth to three years of age will be offered to opportunity to participate in job related training session(s).
