Summary

The Malcolm X College Special Academic Programs Committee has applied for this new grant to support several faculty training sessions on curriculum development and assessment related to civic engagement. As many as 16 Malcolm X College Honors faculty members, and seven Adult Education faculty members would attend two in-house training sessions on developing civic engagement learning objectives. The seminars have the ability to impact up to 3,125 students, with faculty being able to apply quality assessment tools, shared ideas, and learning objectives in the classroom. Funds received from this grant would allow Malcolm X to provide lunch and materials for the seminars, and allow one faculty member to attend a national civic engagement conference.

Summary

The Well-being Seminar Grant is a renewal grant funded by Bringing Theory to Practice (BTOP). Summary

This is a new grant and would involve a minimum of 35 Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) faculty throughout the district. This workshop based grant, in collaboration with Loyola University, would allow City Colleges of Chicago to establish Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to build and integrate inquiry-based and cooperative learning strategies into the classroom. If funded, this grant would have the potential to impact over 2000 students per semester, by providing improved teaching and learning techniques in the classroom, and enhanced student learning. Funds from this grant would be used for faculty stipends and classroom materials.
