North Central Laboratory has donated an Attenuated Total Reflectance Transform Infrared Spectrometer (ATR FTIR) to the Physical Sciences Department at Kennedy-King College. The spectrometer will be used to enhance student learning during laboratory activities and has an estimated value of \$44,000.
