<b>Summary</b>			
This is a new grant opportunity for CCC. Tinkering in the Lab is an integrative and applied learning approach to improve math efficacy among Early Childhood Educators (ECE). CCC, through a collaboration with Western Illinois University, would be able to offer a unique and innovative professional development program that will enable early childhood educators to improve their math-teaching efficacy through the utilization of a tinkering lab. CCC aims to support 50-75 early childhood teachers through this professional development opportunity, and has the ability to reach and impact 300-500 children over the period of the grant. Funds received from this grant would be used to implement and evaluate the program, stipends, materials and supplies.

**Summary**

This Early Head Start Child Care Partner Grant (EHSCCP) is a continuation grant funded by DFSS. With this additional funding our goal is to (1) increase the number of qualified teaching staff in the City of Chicago Early Head Start Programs and (2) increase the number of college students earning a credential of economic value in early childhood education and (3) provide training to assist Early Head Start teaching staff in earning 15 hours of required training per year.

Harold Washington anticipates working with a total of 10-15 Early Head Start students/ teachers and family support specialist. Students will obtain early childhood certificates, college credit or professional development hours. Funds received will be used to pay for early childhood coursework, credentialing fees, textbooks and supplies.

**Summary**

This is a continuation grant for Dawson, and provides CCC with the opportunity to recruit and train residents of Chicago for highway construction jobs. Participants of the program earn credentials that assist them in acquiring apprenticeships, employment and continued education in the areas of engineering and construction. Dawson would provide two training sessions during the grant period. Each session would consist of 450 hours of highway construction training with a target class size of 30 students. Funds received from this grant would be used for student stipends, tuition, training supplies and materials.

### **Summary**

This is a continuation grant for CCC. Through a partnership between the Chicago Housing Authority (CHA) and CCC, CHA residents and Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) participants would be eligible to earn college credit for the completion of a basic certificate, associate's degree or receive job training at low or no cost. The Partners in Education program would continue to assist over 600 CHA and HCV residents with the CCC enrollment process, academic advisement and referrals for career coaching when appropriate. Funds received from this grant would be used to cover the cost of tuition, uniforms, books, and exam fees.

#### **Volkswagen of America, Inc. (PD#1710024)**

Volkswagen of America donated engines, transmissions and special tools to the AutoTech Program at Truman College. These items will be used for student instruction and have an estimated value of \$20,000.
