<b>Summary</b> This is a new grant opportunity for Wright College. With this grant Wright College aims to strengthen recruitment, retention, and completion of students of color at Wright College through equity initiatives embedded into the college's academic plan. Funds received from this grant would be used to create a new, full-time position to institutionalize and lead this work.

<b>Summary</b>			
This is a new five-year grant for CCC in partnership with Northeastern Illinois University. Truman and Wright College faculty would work to recruit CCC students interested in teaching K-12 in STEM related fields as pre-Noyce scholars. Students who participate in pre-Noyce activities, including working with students over the summer and conducting research, would be eligible for the Noyce Scholarship at Northeastern Illinois University upon CCC degree completion. CCC aims to recruit up to 5 students per semester for the Pre-Noyce Program over the five year grant period. Funds received from this grant would be used for faculty stipends, marketing material, supplies and to support students in their work through the Gear Up Program.

Increase the quality and effectiveness of student services and support; Improve operational discipline with a focus on high performance standards including excellent financial management.			
<b>Summary</b>			
This is a new two-year grant for CCC. It is structured as a challenge grant, in which dollars raised from other private donors are "matched" by the Foundation up to the total grant amount. The grant will underwrite the creation and implementation of a Learning Agenda which will support the development and execution of evidence-based research to inform practices and policies and, as a result, improve student outcomes district-wide in enrollment, persistence, completion or transfer, and career placement. The Learning Agenda initiative will help create a supportive learning environment that includes a commitment to examine and share data, to understand and act on our strengths and weaknesses. Funds will support the cost of a District Director of Research and Learning role to lead the work. In the initial months of the project, the priorities will be (1) launching 3 to 4 large-scale research projects with external research partners, (2) formalizing data sharing procedures, and (3) forming the Learning Agenda Team to provide feedback and guidance.

<b>Summary</b>			
This is a new three-year grant for CCC, written in partnership with Thrive Chicago, The Partnership for College Completion, and One Million Degrees. CCC's portion of the grant would be \$212,330. This grant would provide Chicago with the "Lumina Talent Hub" designation, signifying our city's demonstrated commitment to ensuring all our young people have the opportunities to grow, thrive, and actualize their postsecondary goal. This grant would support efforts to increase African American and Hispanic students' degree attainment at CCC and ultimately increase third year retention of CCC graduates at partner 4 year institutions. Funds will support a new staff position housed at CCC to work closely with One Million Degrees to lead the work. Over the course of the three year grant term, we will analyze and document existing promising practices for advising and coaching African American and Hispanic students, codify these practices through technical assistance resources, systematize best practices at CCC, and finally expand these best practices to support CCC graduates success at 4-year partner institutions and encourage bachelor's degree completion among equity populations.
