I. <u>CALL TO ORDER SPECIAL BOARD MEETING</u>

Chair Massey began by calling to order the May 10, 2018 Special Board Meeting at 2:29 p.m.

II. ROLL CALL

Upon confirming quorum, Chair Massey asked the Assistant Board Secretary to call the roll.

III. <u>WELCOME</u>

The Chair began by thanking Interim Presidents Lopez and Lynch for hosting himself and Vice Chair Swanson during their visits to Harold Washington College and Kennedy-King College. Chair Massey also noted that Kennedy-King College would be providing the next Student Trustee, expressing that the Board was looking forward to that appointment.

Chair Massey expressed the wonderful time that he, Vice Chair Swanson, Secretary Duque, and Trustee Griffin had at the CCC graduation ceremony the previous Saturday. The Chair extended his congratulations and thanks to Chancellor Salgado and the team that worked to put the ceremony together.

IV. CHANCELLOR'S UPDATES

The Chancellor began by noting the busy nature of the end of the semester. Chancellor Salgado then moved on to remark on the recent Star Scholar ceremony held in conjunction with CPS. The Chancellor shared about the new addition to the Star Scholar ceremony – CCC Luminaries, faculty and staff members nominated by their peers, recognizing their work and dedication.

Next, the Chancellor noted how phenomenal the CCC graduation ceremony was on Saturday, seeing how the ceremony brought together students and their families. The Chancellor thanked everyone who was there, as well as the faculty for their dedication, not just by coming to graduation but as a whole.

Chancellor Salgado next noted that the Board would be reviewing an adjunct faculty contract, affirming the work that adjunct faculty members contribute to CCC. The Chancellor thanked everyone who worked diligently on the proposal.

Alluding to a resolution included in the Board Packet for consideration, Chancellor Salgado remarked on President Potash's service to CCC and the renewal of a contract between CCC and President Potash. Chancellor Salgado thanked President Potash for his leadership of Wright College.

The Chancellor remarked on the ongoing presidential searches, sharing that he had met with all four search committees that week to thank them for their time and dedication. Chancellor Salgado shared that he met with the Olive-Harvey College search committee to further explain and answer questions as to why he was suspending the presidential search. The Chancellor reaffirmed his commitment to communication and building relationships with the CCC community as a whole.

Acknowledging student dissatisfaction with the current food vendors, Chancellor Salgado remarked on the proposed Board report on the food vendor, Fooda, and the positive changes and flexibility that it would provide for students moving forward. To improve the student experience, Chancellor Salgado also noted the Board report that would consider modernizing the student financial aid process.

The Chancellor remarked on the sale of 226 W. Jackson, as well as the work and flexibility that the District employees have put into the move. Chancellor Salgado noted that by June all District staff would be at or directly next to a college, yet another measure that would better serve students.

VI. <u>DISTRICT UPDATES</u>

Provost Potter gave the District Update, presenting on Agreement 4.01 in the Board Packet, which involves Proeducation Solutions, LLC. Provost Potter spoke about the District's vision in utilizing the services of Proeducation Solutions, LLC, and how it would impact students and staff. The full presentation can be found online.

Professor Alexander gave the Faculty Council Report. In her remarks, Professor Alexander highlighted the FC4 elections, in which she, Professor Jessica Bader, and Professor Julius Nadas were all reelected to serve as President, Vice President, and Secretary of FC4, respectively.
