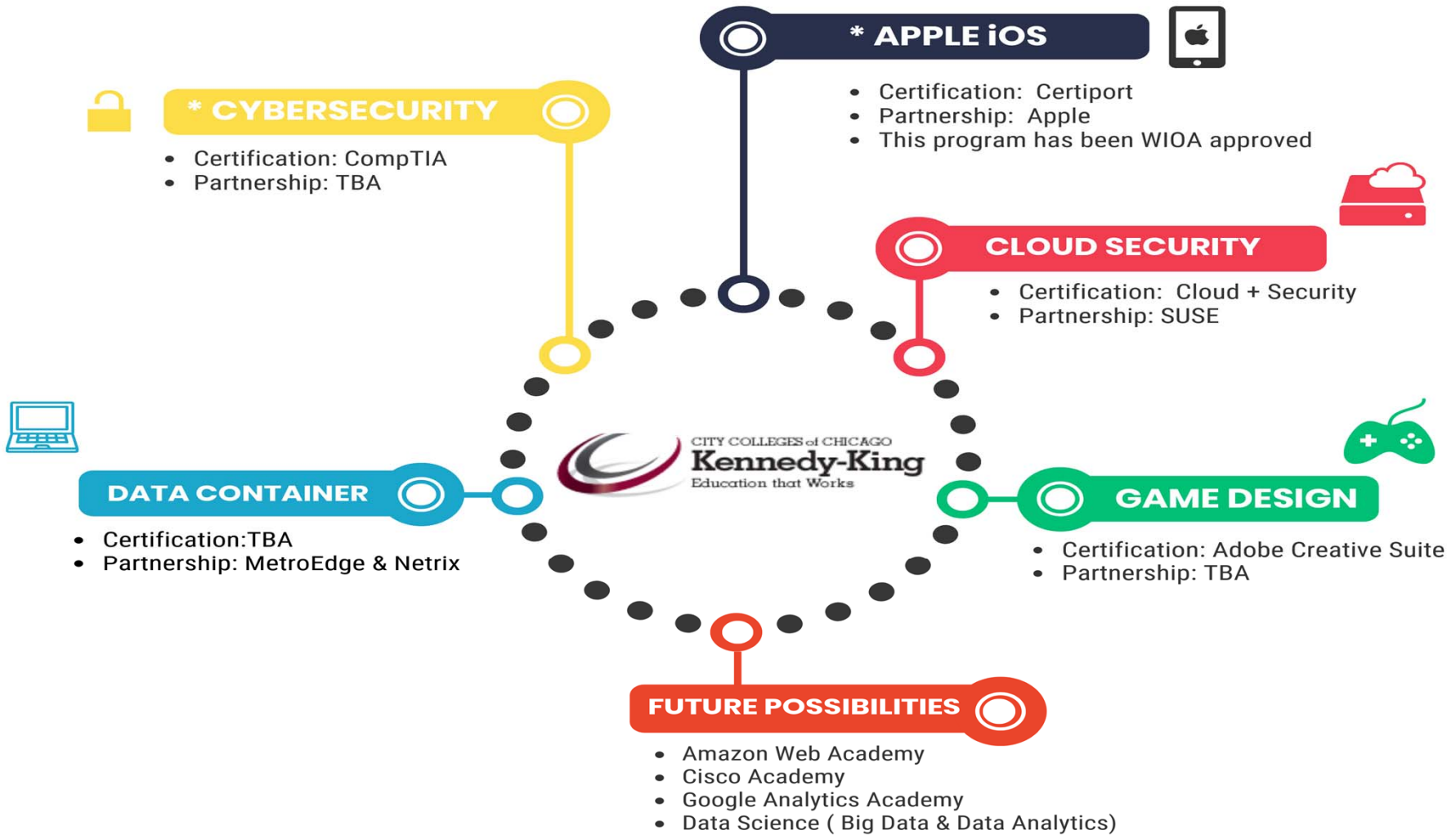

BROADER IMPACT

- **Chicago Public School awareness and exposure**
 - Pathway development
 - TRiO Educational Talent Search Grant (7th – 12th grade exposure)
 - Carl D. Perkins V. Grant (early exposure, beginning at 5th grade)
- **Opportunity Youth**
 - Ages 16-24 not actively engaged in school and/or unemployed
 - *Over 47,000 youth identified in Chicago with a high concentration in Englewood
- **Community Enrichment and Access**
 - Address digital divide
- **Professional Development and Training**
 - Address gender and racial/ethnic gap
- **Program Development and Expansion**
 - Increase KKC enrollment (315:Fall 2019-Spring 2021) , brand, and presence throughout Chicago
