Financial Priorities

Commitment to Affordability

- CCC has **not raised tuition** across the board in four years. Furthermore, last year, CCC made tuition **more equitable** for full & part-time students.
- CCC is also the only community college in the state that caps tuition at 12 credit hours and has no fees.
- CCC continues to invest in student resources, including transit cards to full-time and part-time students (\$4.0M in FY20 Budget)

Free College

- \$8.0M for Star Scholarship program
- \$2.9M Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment, Jump Start to Jobs and Summer Fast Track
- \$0.6M Athletic Waivers

Commitment to Best in Class Facilities

- CCC issued Bonds in 2013 (\$250M) and 2017 (\$78M) \$311M in outstanding debt as of 12/31/18
 - Malcolm X College, School of Health Sciences (2013 Bonds)
 - Daley Manufacturing Technology & Engineering Center (2017 Bonds)
 - Olive-Harvey Transportation, Distribution and Logistics Center (2017 Bonds)

Bad Debt Reduction Strategies

- CCC is implementing strategies to reduce bad debt expense, including:
 - Enforcing payment deadlines (Summer 2019)
 - Other strategies currently under consideration for FY20-21



Indexing Headcount Enrollment Change for 2-Year Public Institutions, FY13 to FY18



ICCB Enrollment: % Change Spring 2018 – Spring 2019 (Headcount)






FY20 Revenue Overview – Unrestricted Resources (\$315.9M)








FY20 Expense Overview – Unrestricted Funds by Cost Center (\$315.9M)






FY20 Expense Overview – Unrestricted Funds by Budget Line (\$315.9M)



Cash Position is stabilizing

- CCC's goal is to establish financial growth stabilization, and provide a positive outlook on the financial position of the District.
- CCC used cash reserves to fund priority investments during the State budget crisis.
- We plan to continue to build cash reserves by achieving operating surpluses for multiple years.
- The sale of 226 W. Jackson will improve our cash position.
