#### **Summary**

This is a continuation grant for Malcolm X College, and would focus on further developing the Community Dental Health Coordinator (CDHC) curriculum. This purpose of this funding is to address the oral health workforce needs and to increase access to high quality oral health services for underserved children located in Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) throughout Illinois.

Approximately 55 MXC dental hygiene students would receive the CDHC curriculum providing them with additional knowledge and experience in public health settings. MXC dental hygiene students would receive both the CDHC Certificate and AAS Degree in Dental Hygiene to prepare them to work in dental shortage areas.

## **Summary**

This a continuation grant for Wright College. This cooperative grant with Northeastern Illinois University, aims to increase success in the two-year to four-year college pathway. This academic partnership between Wright and NEIU will rest on a foundation of shared interest for student access and success by:

- (1) Connecting high school students and their families from the target communities shared by Wright and NEIU to the local high education system and prepare them for the math and English demands of a college education.
- (2) Enhancing the freshman and sophomore experience at Wright by bringing to scale structures to support early goal-setting and academic success that will translate into degree attainment.
- (3) Enhancing the advising transfer pathway between Wright and NEIU through utilization of the newly launched Guaranteed and Dual Admission (GDA) agreement.
- (4) Supporting degree attainment at NEIU through third- and fourth-year career preparation support, especially in teacher preparation.
