CCC will develop the infrastructure, strategies, and tools to achieve unprecedented and equitable student outcomes, putting CCC on-track to narrow its equity gaps by a third by 2025 and close them entirely by 2032. The funds will be used for new dashboards to help CCC better harness equity data, a training plan to seed continuous improvement champions across CCC, and an innovative microgrant program to rapidly test new strategies and identify what works for transfer or scale.</p>
