Summary

This is a new subaward grant for the District. This grant will support City Colleges' efforts to participate in an Alliance led by Chicago State University, consisting of two NSF data science centers (Northeast Big Data Innovation Hub and Midwest Big Data Innovation Hub), two national laboratories (Argonne National

Laboratory and Brookhaven National Laboratory), an industrial partner (IBM), and other educational institutions and organizations. The subcontract will support tasks at City Colleges of Chicago, (CCC), in collaboration with other organizations involved in this project towards a joint proposal to form an Alliance dedicated to preparing a diverse 21st century STEM workforce with expertise in data science and visualization in two US major cities (Chicago and New York). CCC will use the funds to partner and work to recruit students to the Alliance, as well as connect current faculty with cutting-edge researchers through bootcamps, institutes and other professional development activities, both virtual and in-person as appropriate, including leveraging the NSF funded Northeast and Midwest Big Data Innovation Hubs.
