





The MXC Nursing Program prepares frontline healthcare heroes


The Nursing program provides multiple on- and off-ramps through a stackable credential pathway.

- ► The Basic Nursing Assistant (BNA) Program expands access through Adult Education Bridge, Early College, and First-Year experiences that prepare students to be Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs) in healthcare facilities across Chicago
- ▶ The Practical Nursing (PN) Program contextualizes learning through capstone experiences
- ▶ The AAS Registered Nurse (RN) program is dedicated to recruiting and supporting students of color, preparing them for the NCLEX certification exam and entry into a career.

Nursing NCLEX Pass Rates: The MXC NCLEX pass rates are consistently above national and state average. [IL88%, US87% FY20]




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Nursing AAS enrollment has grown by 16% over the last five years.


BNA enrollment has grown by 35% from FY17 to FY20.
