The Opportunity Liaison will bridge the connections to the partnerships between Chicago Public Schools (CPS), disability services agencies, the City Colleges of Chicago (CCC), and the business community across Chicago, and resulting opportunity will be available for people with disabilities to transition into meaningful activity as an adult.</p> <p>The funding will be used to provide staff, administrative time, materials, curriculum development for the program.</p>
