Summary

This is a new grant for Kennedy-King. Kennedy-King College (KKC) is actively working to create a three-year strategic plan to serve approximately 600 students pursuing academic pathways in the IT sector, including a financial outlook and fundraising campaign that will serve to ensure its continued success. As part of this strategic planning effort, KKC has created an equity-focused initiative titled the Tech Launchpad that is driven by two imperatives: social equity and workforce equity. To address each imperative, KKC is launching several traditional and non-traditional IT academic programs to provide Chicago residents with opportunities to pursue careers that lead to positive economic mobility and to close equity gaps in the industry.

The \$1 million investment will accelerate strategic and academic programming efforts designed to address equity gaps in the IT industry, while simultaneously creating a partnership model between academic and industry stakeholders that can be scaled and replicated in support of future partnership and investment opportunities.
