Professional Development for faculty in the areas of Advanced Manufacturing and Health Sciences to ensure instructors are prepared to integrate AI technologies into the classroom, supporting the necessary continued engagement and development of faculty to keep up with			

course credentialing and instructional demands. 3. Equipment updates necessary to fully implement the newly developed curriculum. The funds will be used for funding travel for attendance at Principal Investigator Meetings, consultant services that will include curriculum writers and faculty development based on the Institute recommendations, and computer services that will include software to implement the new curriculum.
